Almost all UB students should qualify for some FREE money. If you are planning on going on an LDS mission after you graduate, you need to still apply to a college and defer. This will also hold any scholarships you may get.

The UB Summer applications are due February 14, 2020. If you have not received an application and you would still like to attend the Summer Program, please reach out to your UB Advisor. We will place you on a waiting list, where you will have a chance to be added, if a student drops out. During the UB Summer Program, you will have an opportunity to get a better understanding of what college life will be like once you're in college. It will also be a great opportunity for you to earn 6 to 7 college credits for FREE. We will only be accepting 50 students to take advantage of this great opportunity. Don't miss out!


