UINTAH HIGH SCHOOL

Only seven weeks left in the school year! Don't just hang in there, sprint to the finish line and finish the school year strong! We are currently preparing for the summer program. Those of you who are new to the Summer Program will need to complete the UVU Admissions Application by April 23. I do have a code that you can enter in when filling out the application that will waive the admissions application fee. When you are ready to complete the application, please see me for the fee waiver code. If you have participated in the summer program in the past, you will not need to be readmitted to UVU. All of you will need to register for the two courses, Fitness for Life (PES 1097, 2 credits) and Public Speaking (COMM 1020, 3 credits). Please refer to the email from Rebecca Ayala for instructions on registering for the two courses. The registration system may show class fees of \$135. You do not need to pay this fee. Rebecca is working on getting these class fees waived.

For those of you who did not apply for the summer program, I believe you can still do so. Once you complete the application you will be placed on a waiting list with the chance of being admitted to the summer program in the case of students dropping out of the program. If you are not participating in the summer program this summer, consider finding a summer job. Ashley National Forest is looking to fill a number of summer positions with the average pay being \$15/hr. If I hear of other job opportunities, I will certainly let you know. Consider taking some summer classes as well from UBTech, USU if possible, or from Uintah Online. You can knock out some of your core class requirements this way. For example, several students will take the US Government or Financial Literacy classes online. Doing so, will free up your schedule some during the school year and allow you to take some college classes through USU at very little cost.
