
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NEWS from our UB ADVISORS


UB PRESIDENCY MESSAGE

According to a 2017 report from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, those who only had a high school diploma earned an average of \$712 per week as compared to those with a bachelor's degree earning \$1,173 per week. Additionally, the unemployment rate for those with only a high school diploma was 4.6%, compared to only 2.5% for those with a bachelor's degree.
