The better the GPA you have, the more scholarships and opportunities you will qualify for to help you pay for college.

Seniors, right now you should be applying to colleges and for

financial aid. Your UB advisor is there to help you get through this process, step by step. Please reach out to them and ask for help. Every senior who is in UB needs to apply to at least one college and apply for financial aid. The FASFA is free money that the government will give you to go to college. Almost all UB students should qualify for some FREE money. If you are planning on going on an LDS mission after you graduate, you need to still apply to a college and defer. This will also hold any scholarships you may get. Work with your UB Advisor if you need to defer.

The UB Summer applications were due January 31, 2021. If you would still like to attend the Summer Program, please reach out to your UB Advisor. You will be placed on a waiting list, where you will have a chance to be added if a spot opens up. During the UB Summer Program, you will have an opportunity to get a better understanding of what college life will be like once you're in college. Although It will be online it will still be a great opportunity for you to earn 5 to 6 college credits for FREE. We will only be accepting 50 students to take advantage of this great opportunity. 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




OREM & PROVO HIGH SCHOOLS
