#### **Pillar: Student Success**

<u>Vision Statement</u>: UVU aims to provide a transformative educational experience that prepares students for their careers and educated individuals enhances their personal growth and prepares them to flourish in an ever-changing world.

<u>Objective #1</u>: Empower students for personal and academic success through a strong educational foundation that fosters independence and cultivates self-directed learning skills, and seamlessly integrates disciplinary knowledge with essential skills.

- Goal 1A: Ensure students develop mastery with essential skills in communication, critical thinking, digital literacy, ethical reasoning, inclusion, information literacy, quantitative literacy, and scientific literacy.
- Goal 1B: Equip students to navigate flexible learning environments successfully.
- Goal 1C: Enhance infrastructure supports to establish robust systems and services that assist students and facilitate timely access to resources.
- Goal 1D: Cultivate the development of leadership skills among students.

<u>Objective #2</u>: Promote student involvement to foster a sense of community and belonging beyond the classroom.

- Goal 2A: Create transformative opportunities for students to engage in co-curricular experiences that impact their personal, academic, and career goals.
- Goal 2B: Welcome new and returning students at the onset of each semester with wellcoordinated events.
- Goal 2C: Implement a dynamic student communication plan that utilizes various
  platforms, delivers information at the optimal frequency, crafts targeted messages to
  specific student groups, and incorporates feedback mechanisms to foster a two-way
  communication flow.

<u>Objective #3</u>: Prepare students for future careers through educational offerings and workforce connections that nurture creativity, innovation, and interdisciplinary collaboration.

- Goal 3A: Augment and broaden engaged and high-impact learning opportunities that are accessible to students through various modes of instruction.
- Goal 3B: Elevate career preparedness activities through mentoring activities, industry certifications, and customized events.
- Goal 3C: Increase student connection to interdisciplinary collaboration through engaged learning opportunities.

#### Pillar: Faculty and Staff Success

<u>Vision Statement</u>: UVU cultivates a thriving environment of excellence and opportunity, attracting and retaining top talent, and empowering faculty and staff to excel both individually and collaboratively in a shared responsibility for student success.

Objective #1: Foster a workplace culture that attracts and retains diverse, innovative, and discipline-leading faculty and staff.

- Goal 1A: Develop proactive mechanisms to attract and incentivize retention of excellent faculty and staff members.
- Goal 1B: Enhance and optimize faculty retention, tenure, and promotion frameworks and annual performance review processes to support career growth and institutional excellence.
- Goal 1C: Support faculty and staff in becoming leaders in their disciplines and within the
  university by providing opportunities for professional growth and recognition.
- Goal 1D: Expand opportunities for faculty and staff to engage in informal and supportive contexts with feedback mechanisms that enhance overall workplace satisfaction.

Objective #2: Invest in faculty and staff professional development to elevate teaching quality and the effectiveness of student support services.

- Goal 2A: Support faculty training and certification in updated pedagogical methods and technologies to enhance the delivery of engaging and effective instruction.
- Goal 2B: Support staff training in the skills and resources necessary to provide comprehensive support to students.

Objective #3: Advance discovery and knowledge through faculty- and staff-led creative endeavors, entrepreneurship, and research.

- Goal 3A: Expand the number and scope of faculty- and staff-led projects in creative endeavors, entrepreneurship, and research across disciplines.
- Goal 3B: Promote collaborations between faculty and staff members from different departments or fields of expertise to encourage innovative projects in creative endeavors, entrepreneurship, and research.
- Goal 3C: Explore commercialization, dissemination, and partnership opportunities stemming from faculty- and staff-led projects in creative endeavors, entrepreneurship, and research.
