The Master of Accountancy (MAcc) is designed to develop the next generation of professional accountants. The MAcc qualifies students for entry-level positions in public accounting, industry, government, and not-for-profit organizations. The MAcc qualifies students to sit for the Uniform CPA Examinations in Utah and many other states, which is a necessary step in becoming a Certified Public Accountant (CPA). It also provides a base to pursue related certifications as Certified Internal Auditor (CIA), Certified Management Accountant (CMA), and Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE). Ultimately, a MAcc can lead to a wide variety of significant leadership positions in accounting and business including controller, CFO, and CEO.

Applications for Fall semester open November 1. Application deadline is April 1 or until program is full. (First Review of Applicants for each Fall semester is February 1, which is also the priority deadline.)

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Admissions Criteria + Online Application + Final Decision

Learn about the admissions criteria you need to meet before applying, what information you will need to submit a successful application, and how you will be notified of the final decision.



ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

Applicants are expected to meet the following criteria:

1. Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. institution
2. Minimum overall undergraduate GPA 3.0
3. Minimum GPA of 3.0 in upper-division accounting courses
4. International students must complete the Test Of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

At the discretion of the MAcc admission committee the TOEFL requirements may be waived for students supplying sufficient evidence of preparation for the MAcc program. Admission to the MAcc program is competitive. Meeting the minimum requirements above does not guarantee admission.

The GMAT is no longer required for admission to our program.

Students with non-accounting undergraduate bachelor degrees are also eligible to complete the prerequisites and apply for the program. Applications for these students will only be reviewed when at least three prerequisite classes are completed.

PREREQUISITE COURSES

Students with undergraduate bachelor degrees in accounting must complete the following UVU prerequisite courses or equivalent before they begin the program:

Students with non-accounting undergraduate bachelor degrees are also eligible to complete the prerequisites and apply for the program.

Applications for these applicants will only be reviewed once they have completed at least three of the above prerequisites.
