





Age Exception Policy

Students who wish to be considered for admission must have graduated from high school; and/or received an equivalent of a high school diploma; and/or are beyond compulsory high school age. New freshmen under the age of 17 and who have not graduated high school seeking admission must apply for exception through the Admissions Office. The student must submit all required documents for admission and demonstrate through assessment testing the ability to succeed. After meeting with the student and at least one parent or guardian in person, the Director or Associate Director of Admissions will make the final determination for admittance. Students are required to be in the non-degree seeking status High School Concurrent Enrollment (HSCE) until they graduate from high school, receive a GED or are beyond compulsory high school age. Students are required to take ACT/ACT-R or SAT testing and at a minimum must qualify to enter English and Math at a college level (1010 or above.) Students that do not meet testing minimums, are under the age of 15, or are otherwise found to not be college ready will not be granted an exception to policy.

UNIVERSITY MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- → Bachelor's degree from a regionally or nationally accredited college or university
- → 3.0 cumulative GPA or 3.0 calculated GPA based on last 60 semester hours (90 quarter hours) of undergraduate work.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

REQUIRED ITEMS

- → \$50 application fee
- → College transcripts
- → Bachelor's degree
- → Required admissions documentation (varies by program)
- · GRE, GMAT
- Essay responses
- Resume
- Letters of recommendation

International admission requirements remain the same as domestic with the addition of the following:

- English Proficiency- TOEFL score of 80 IBT (550 pBT) or IELTS score of 6.5 or higher within the last two years.
- Affidavit of Support- Uplood a signed affidavit of support that has been completed by the person accepting financial responsibility. Each graduate program has its own specific form.
- Bank Statement- Provide document as requested on Affidavit of Support from student or sponsor. All financial support documents must be in English and show amounts in U.S. funds.
- Copy Of Passport- Attach a copy of the passport for the student and any dependents who will also need on I-20.

INTERNATIONAL APPLICATION DEADLINES

MAY 15 - FALL SEMESTER OCT 1 - SPRING SEMESTER

International students can only be accepted into full-time graduate programs. Please check with your program of interest to ensure that it offers a full-time option. Those programs currently include MBA, MAcc, MEd: Teacher Leadership, and MSW.



- dollars.)




If you are transferring your I-20 from another college or university in the United States.

REQUIRED ITEMS

- → \$115 application fee
- → Official High School Transcripts or Record Equivalent
- → Transfer certification form
- → English Proficiency
- → TOEFL 66 or higher iBT, IELTS 6.0 or higher, or Duolingo 100 or higher
- (not required notive English speakers) → Affidavit of support and financial statements
- (All financial support papers must be in English, showing amounts in U.S.

WHAT'S NEXT AFTER YOU APPLY

1. COMPLETE THE APPLICATION

Fill out the application completely (must be 18 years or older to apply) and pay the \$115 application fee.

2. AFFIDAVIT OF SUPPORT

The Affidavit of Support form is to be completed by the person who will be providing money for tuition, fees and living expenses, with an original bank statement or Tax return attached. Please note: If you are sponsoring yourself you will need to provide a letter from your bank showing the needed amount on deposit under your name.

All financial support papers must be in english, showing amounts in U.S. Dollars.

3. OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS OR RECORDS

Send official transcripts or records, with your application, showing you have graduated from a school level that meets U.S. high school requirements for graduation.

4. ENGLISH PROFICIENCY IS REQUIRED

exam will determine your first semester classes.

You must submit either an official TOEFL test score (66 or better, IBT), IELTS- 6.0 or better, or Duolingo of 100 or better). Test scores must be less than one year old. If you meet English proficiency requirements, you must take an entrance exam prior to registering for classes. This

5. TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER INSTITUTION

A This step applies to transfer students only.

If you transfer from another institution in the United States, your previous school must complete the Transfer certification form. Put your name on the top of the document, and give the form to the previous school. The previous school will complete the form and send it directly to Utah Valley University along with an official copy of your transcript from their institution.

6. NOTICE OF PROCESSING TIME

Please allow 3-4 weeks for documents to be reviewed, processed, and returned to you in time for your current school to transfer your SEVIS record (I-20) to UVU prior to the beginning of class. You will be required to attend a mandatory orientation for all new UVU students.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Insurance is not required to attend Utah Valley University. Due to the cost of medical care, Utah Valley University recommends all international students acquire appropriate health insurance.

HB-118 TUITION WAIVER

Any student who holds a valid non-immigrant visa who meets specific requirements may be exempt from paying the nonresident portion of the total tuition at Utah Valley University. Find requirements and check to see if you qualify here.



Utah Valley University Concurrent Enrollment is an academic program that partners with and serves high schools and communities. It provides access to, preparation for, and higher education experience. Our program offers an entire dimension of courses to a wide variety of students.



Our goal is to offer every student the opportunity to have an authentic college experience while in high school.





Explore Your Future

Concurrent Enrollment is an educational partnership between high schools in our service region and UVU. After a high school student is admitted to UVU, they can register for UVU Concurrent Enrollment classes! Classes are taught by a UVU-endorsed high school instructor or live-streamed by a current UVU professor.

Tuition for a UVU Concurrent Enrollment class is only \$5 per credit hour! This reduced tuition helps high school students earn college credit while still in high school, allowing them to continue their educational journey beyond their regular high school classes. Students can schedule a meeting with their high school's Concurrent Enrollment advisor to discuss which classes align with their educational and career goals.





ALL STUDENTS

Note:
