### *Fall 2021*

- In August 2021, UVU moved all academic advising directors from reporting in their individual schools and colleges to have a central reporting to academic programs in the Academic Affairs Division.
- In November 2021, UVU renamed Student Life and its associated programs in the Student Affairs Division as Student Development and Well-Being to focus on a fuller development of students and their college experience.
- In November 2021, UVU created the Inclusive Excellence Department to include student services for international, first-generation, and multicultural students, as well as the Veterans Success Center, Women's Success Center, and Accessibility Services in the Student Affairs Division.
- In December 2021, UVU moved the University Relations Department from the Marketing and Communications Division to the Administration and Strategic Relations Division.

### *Spring 2022*

- In March 2022, UVU created the Gary R. Herbert Institute of Public Policy in the Academic Affairs Division.
- In April 2022, UVU moved the Business Resource Center & Small Business Development Center from the Academic Affairs Division to the Administration and Strategic Relations Division.

### *Summer 2022*

- In June 2022, UVU dissolved University College in the Academic Affairs Division and moved the Literacies and Composition Department to the College of Humanities and Social Science and the Mathematical and Quantitative Reasoning Department to the College of Science.
- In July 2022, UVU established a new role of associate provost in the Academic Affairs Division and restructured responsibilities within an existing associate provost position. This restructuring resulted in two distinct portfolios: one for the associate provost for academic programs and assessment, and another for the associate provost for student success.

- In July 2022, the Office of Engaged Learning was renamed to Innovation Academy in the Academic Affairs Division.

### ***Fall 2022***

- In September 2022, the UVU Online program became a stand-alone program reporting to the associate provost of academic programs & assessment in the Academic Affairs Division.
- In September 2022, the Strategic Communications department was created in the Marketing & Communications Division.
- In November 2022, UVU moved the CARE Hub from the Center for Social Impact to its own department, reporting to the associate dean of students in the Student Affairs Division.
- In November 2022, the Woodbury Art Museum was renamed to the UVU Museum of Art and moved from the University Mall to Lakemount Manor, which was generously donated to UVU by the B.W. Bastian Foundation.

### ***Spring 2023***

- In January 2023, UVU moved institutional accreditation and planning from the Planning, Budget, and Finance Division to the Academic Affairs Division. At the same time, Dr. Laurie Sharp, associate provost for academic programs and assessment, was named as UVU's designated Accreditation Liaison Officer for NWCCU.
- In January 2023, UVU renamed the College of Engineering and Technology to the Smith College of Engineering and Technology.
- In January 2023, the Academic Affairs Student Success Department was renamed to the Adult Learner Initiative Department to include Testing Services Department in the Academic Affairs Division.
- In February 2023, UVU merged the Institutional Research and Business Intelligence Services Departments in the Digital Transformation Division to create the Business Intelligence and Research Services Department.
- In March 2023, the Career Development Center Department was renamed to the Career & Internship Center and moved from the Student Affairs Division to the Academic Affairs Division in the Innovation Academy.
- In May 2023, UVU reorganized and moved community, continuing, and executive education programs from the Academic Affairs Division to the Finance and Auxiliary Services Division.
- In May 2023, UVU reorganized and moved the Policy Office from the Finance and Auxiliary Services Division to the Office of General Counsel.

### ***Fall 2023***

- In August 2023, UVU renamed the Finance Division to the Finance and Auxiliary Services Division.
- In September 2023, the Inclusive Excellence Department was renamed to the Student Services Department, which included Multicultural, International, and LGBTQ+ Student Services as well as Accessibility Services, Veteran Success Center, and Women's Success Center.
- In October 2023, the Digital Transformation Division was restructured, realigning departments within the division under the newly renamed associate vice president of Partner Solutions and Technology Support, associate vice president of Platform Technologies, senior

director of Product Portfolio Management, senior director of Operational Excellence, Principal Enterprise Architect, and the finance manager.

### ***Spring 2024***

- In February 2024, Starbucks was moved from reporting to the Campus Store to reporting to Dining Services in the Finance and Auxiliary Services Division.
- In February 2024, the Engineering Department was split into the Electrical and Computer Engineering Department and the Mechanical and Civil Engineering Department in the Smith College of Engineering and Technology.
- In March 2024, UVU responded to new state legislation requirements from House Bill 261 in the 2024 Utah Legislative Session and reorganized the Office of Inclusion Diversity to the Office of Institutional Engagement and Effectiveness. In addition to the retitling of Dr. Rasha Qudisat, associated changes included: (a) current members of the Office of Inclusion and Diversity continue reporting to Dr. Rasha Qudisat and will have new titles and redefined job responsibilities, (b) Data Collection and Research will move from Business Intelligence and Research Services to the Office of Institutional Engagement and Effectiveness to support institutional effectiveness and assessment activities, and (c) the Campus Equity, Inclusion, and Diversity Committee will be renamed but will continue its efforts to create a place for all students and employees through strategic planning and collaboration.
- In April 2024, oversight of UVU's Wasatch Campus was moved to Continuing Education in the Finance and Auxiliary Services Division. Previously, its oversight was in the Workforce Alignment Department in the Academic Affairs Division.
- In April 2024, the Workforce Development Department was renamed to the Workforce Alignment Department in the Academic Affairs Division.

### ***Summer 2024***

- In July 2024, UVU's School of Education reorganized and created the Graduate Education Department. Identified faculty and graduate curriculum were reorganized into the new department.
- In July 2024, UVU's Smith College of Engineering and Technology reorganized and dissolved the Engineering Technology Department. Identified faculty and curriculum were reorganized and moved into two existing departments, the Transportation Technologies Department and the Technology Management Department. These two departments were renamed as the Transportation, Automation, and Electrical Technologies Department and the Technology Management and Mechatronic Systems Department.
- In July 2024, UVU's College of Health and Public Service reorganized and created the Health Sciences Department. Identified faculty and curriculum in the Public Health Department were reorganized and moved into the new department.
- In July 2024, the College of Humanities and Social Sciences reorganized and split the Behavioral Sciences Department into two new departments: the Social and Behavioral Sciences Department and the Psychology and Counseling Department. Identified faculty and curriculum were reorganized and moved into the two new departments.
- In July 2024, the College of Humanities and Social Sciences reorganized and dissolved the Literacies and Composition Department. Identified faculty and curriculum were reorganized into the English Department.

Two data sets (i.e., First Generation and Adult Learner) have uncertain values for Fall 2020 and Fall 2021 due to missing third-week enrollment data and improvements made with identifying first-generation students. Despite this uncertainty, the data revealed year-over-year growth in total university enrollment and in student enrollment across various demographic categories, including male, female, nonresident alien, Hispanic/Latino, Black or African American, two or more races, and unknown race. Additionally, there was consistent growth in student enrollment for majors within the School of the Arts over the same period.

However, during the same timeframe, the data also indicated declines in student enrollment among several demographic categories, including American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and White. Furthermore, additional student enrollment declines were experienced among adult learners, first-generation students, and majors within the College of Health and Public Service, College of Humanities and Social Sciences, College of Science, School of Education, Smith College of Engineering and Technology, and Woodbury School of Business.

- In March 2024, a UVU student-athlete was named to the 2023-2024 Academic All-District Men's Basketball Team selected by the College Sports Communicators.
- In March 2024, three UVU student-athletes were named to the 2023-2024 Academic All-District Women's Basketball Team selected by the College Sports Communicators.
- In April 2024, UVU broke ground on the UCCU Soccer Stadium on the Orem campus.

- In April 2024, groundbreaking for the UCCU Soccer Stadium. Major donor UCCU and many of their employees were present.
- In April 2024, completed a functional exercise with the EOC (emergency operations center) and Policy group for an earthquake exercise scenario.
- In April 2024, the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) named 54 student-athletes at UVU as 2024 Academic All-WAC honorees for winter sports.
- In April 2024, UVU participated in a full-scale exercise as part of the statewide Earthquake exercise day, commonly known as The Great Shakeout.
- In April 2024, two UVU students were two of 338 student-athletes honored as National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) Scholar All-Americans.
- In April 2024, UVU completed engagement in multiple community exercises, providing support in exercise evaluation, design, and execution. Notably, UVU facilitated a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) tabletop exercise involving over 200 participants from the community, with a representative from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region XIII in attendance. Subsequently, UVU's county LEPC received commendation from FEMA Region XIII for the exemplary execution of the exercise.
- In May 2024, the People and Culture Division earned the Healthy Worksite Award by the Utah Worksite Wellness Council for the university's Employee UVUFit program.
- In May 2024, First Year Advising moved into newly renovated space in the Woodbury Building. Completing a student focused center at the heart of campus.
