In addition to offering rigorous and engaging coursework, the School of Health utilizes simulations, labs, and clinicals, which provide hands on learning and training experiences. This approach enables UVU graduates to integrate into the workforce quickly, ready to contribute to the healthcare industry.

We have been working to rapidly expand the student capacity of our existing health programs and propose new programs to meet the community's need for healthcare workers. We are excited to launch a nutrition minor and a health and wellness coaching certificate starting fall semester 2023, with occupational therapy assistant and physical therapist assistant programs coming in the next several years. We believe in offering education from a holistic perspective, helping students develop the resilience and coping skills they need to serve our community and care for our loved ones.

UVU's geographic area will be responsible for **68.1% of projected growth** in registered nursing and licensed practical nursing fields through 2032.



Physician assistant employment opportunities are **projected to exceed the average projected growth** of all other occupations across Utah and UVU's geographical area.



UVU's Provo Orem metropolitan area is projected to see a **42.1% increase** in respiratory therapy jobs by 2032.
