
About the Noorda

Welcome to the Noorda Center – our building was established in 2019 with the official opening happening in March 2019. The Noorda Center is about 135,000 square feet with 6 performing venues:

- Bastian Theatre (BlackBox)
- Smith Theatre (Traditional Proscenium Theatre)
- Concert Hall
- Nuskin Recital Hall
- Jones Dance Theatre
- Outdoor Amphitheatre

The Noorda Center hosts anywhere between 225-250 events each year supporting our academic units -Music, Theatre, Dance, and Art & Design, as well as our Noorda series which is our professional touring companies that use our facilities, and outside guests - political rallies, large scale events such as weddings and various festivals. In the atrium of the Noorda is the beautiful art installation titled Verga. Verga mirrors the light outside and the status of Utah Lake this exceptional piece brings together the beauty of art and nature. This is really a spectacular place on campus with our view of Mt. Timpanogos.
