



PERCENT OF LGBTQ+ OR UNSURE BY CLASS STANDING

NATIONAL RISK BEHAVIORS FOR LGBTQ+ VERSUS CIS-GENDER YOUTH



- More than one-third (36 percent) of LGBT undergraduate students have experienced harassment within the past year, as have 29 percent of all respondents.
- Those who experienced harassment reported that derogatory remarks were the most common form (89 percent) and that students were most often the source of harassment (79 percent).
- Twenty percent of all respondents feared for their physical safety because of their sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Fifty-one percent concealed their sexual orientation or gender identity to avoid intimidation.
- LGBT students, when compared with their heterosexual peers, were: -over 3 times more likely to have skipped school in the past month because they felt unsafe at or en route to school -over 3 times more likely to have been threatened or injured with a weapon at school in the past year.
