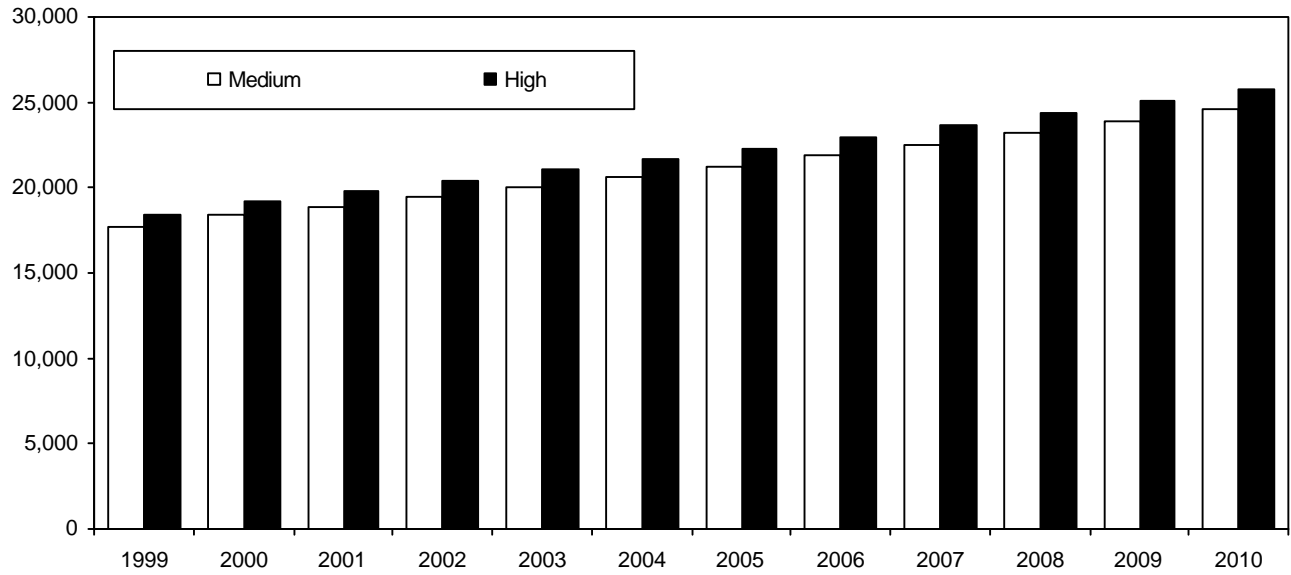

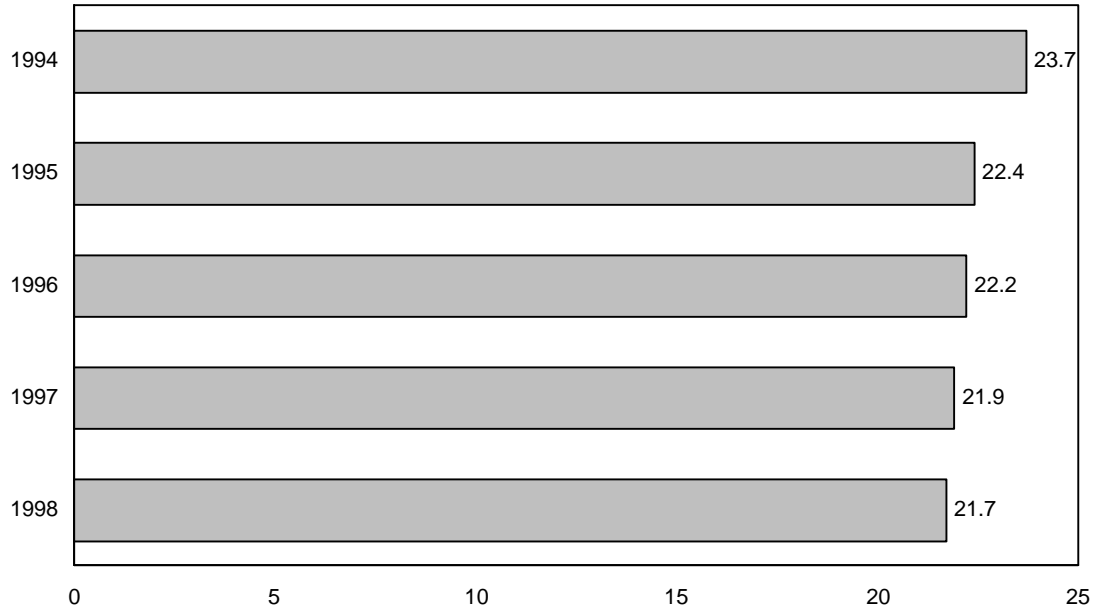
**UTAH VALLEY STATE COLLEGE

MEAN AGE OF STUDENTS

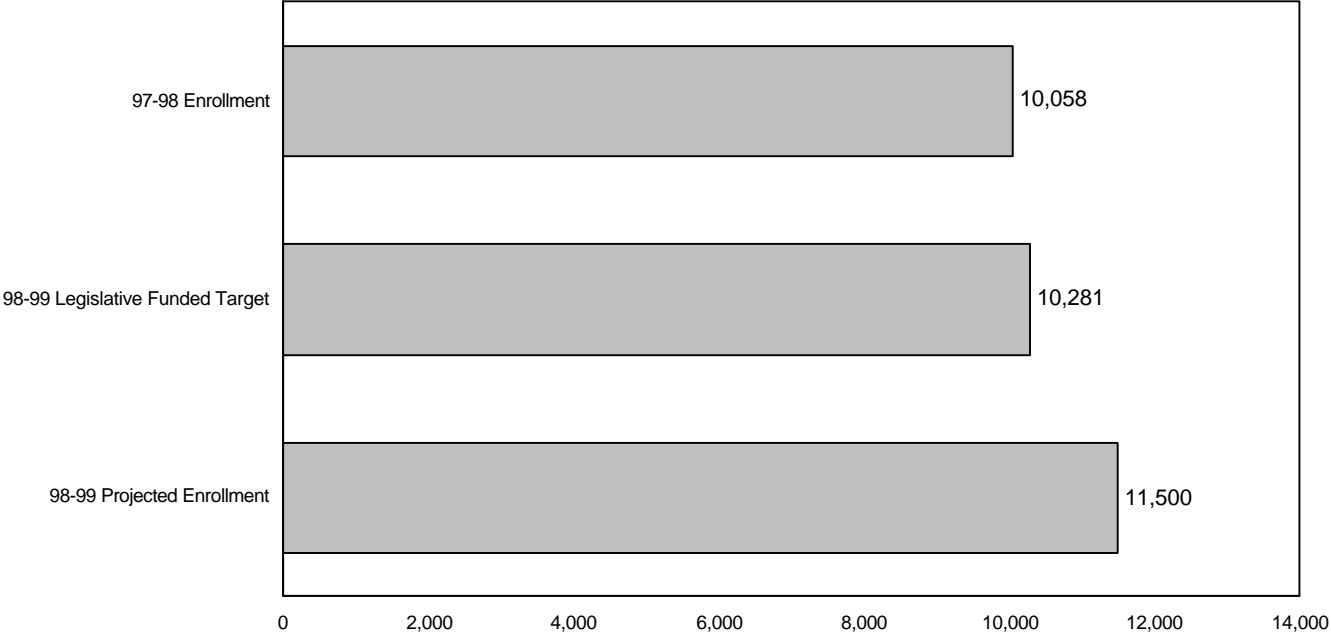
Fall Semesters 1994-1998

ENROLLMENT COMPARISON

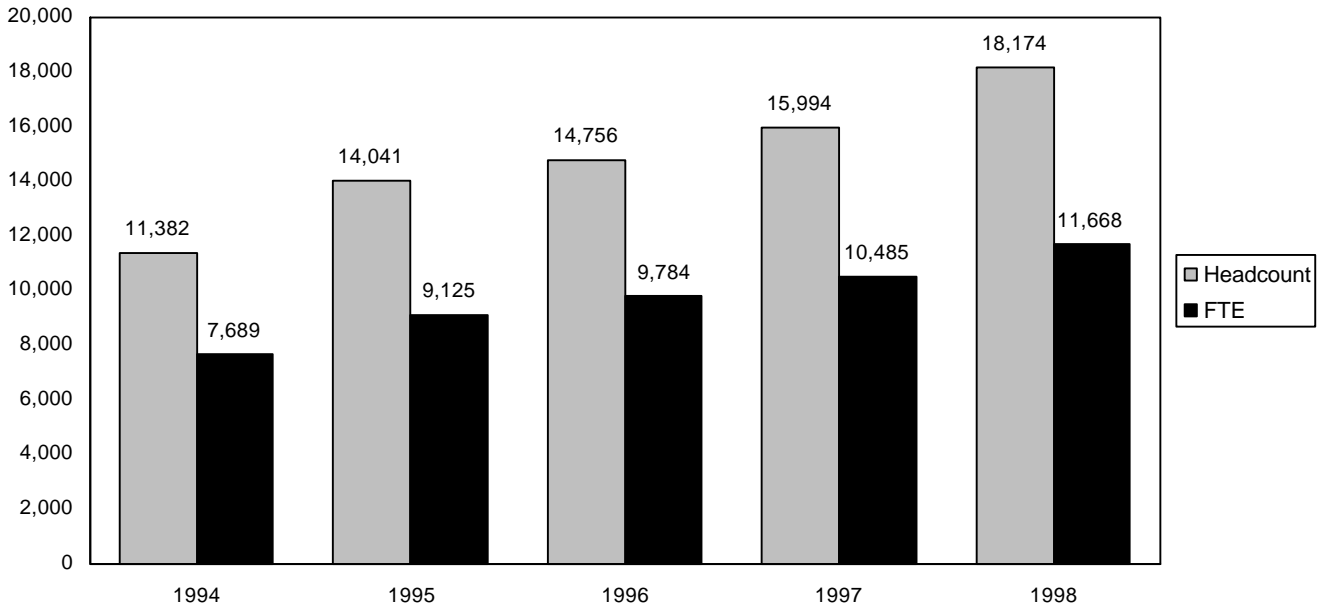
Annualized FTE Students

ENROLLMENT HISTORY

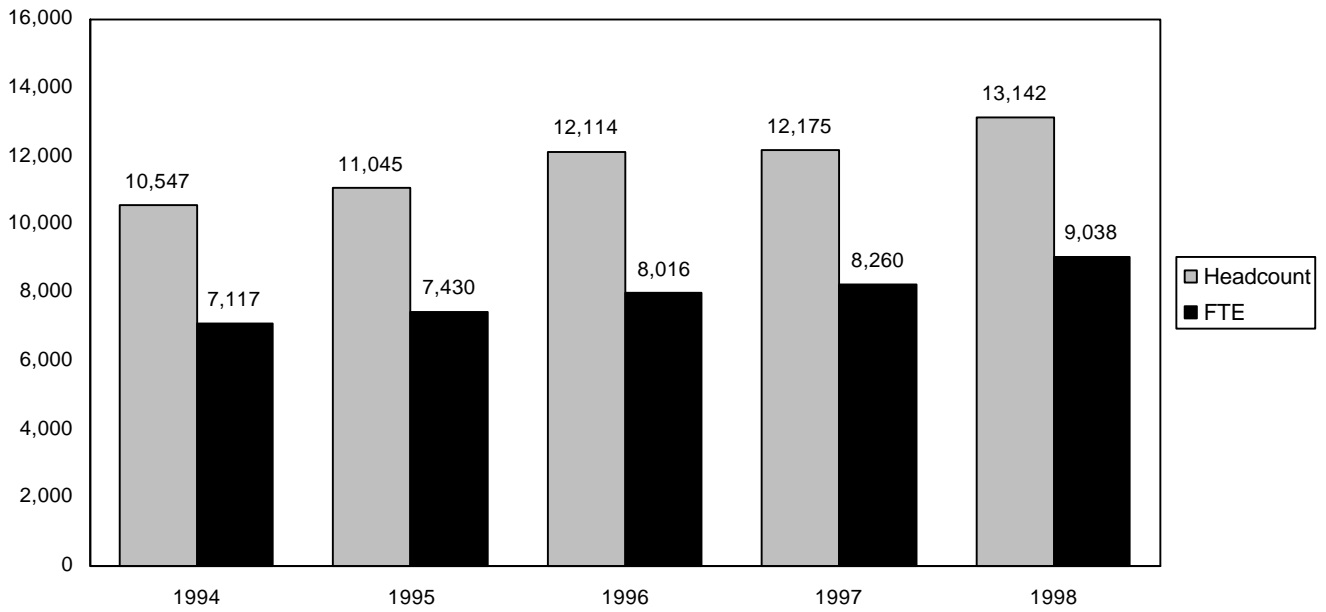

ENROLLMENT HISTORY

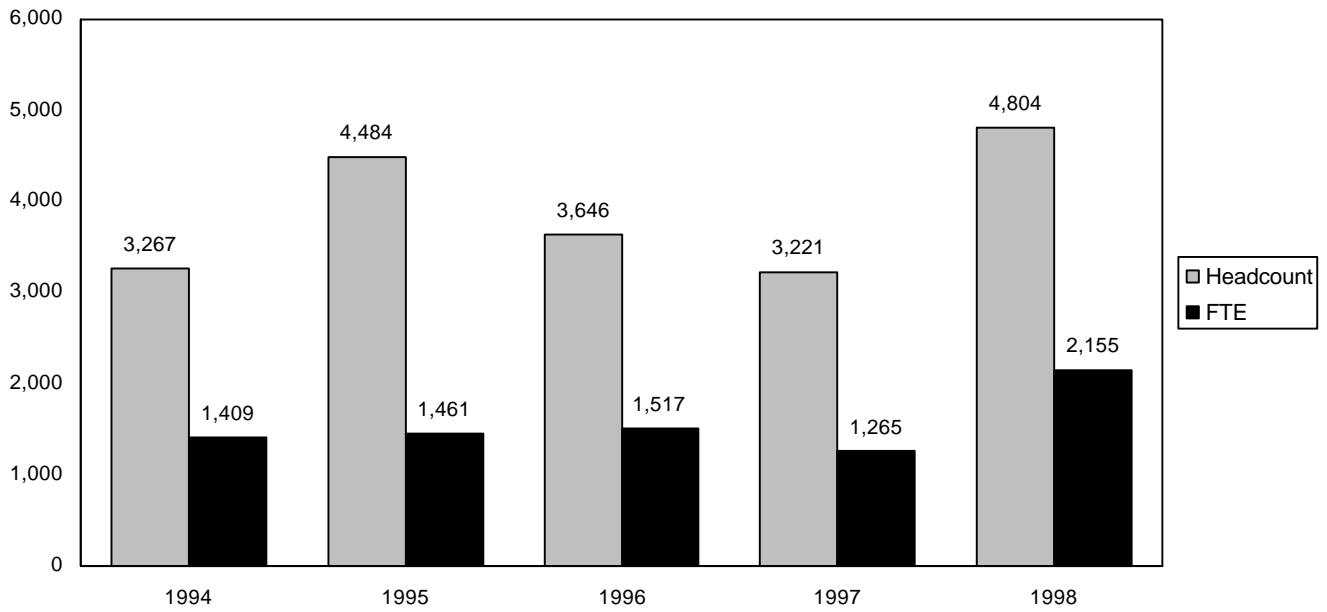
Spring Semester 1994-1998

ENROLLMENT HISTORY

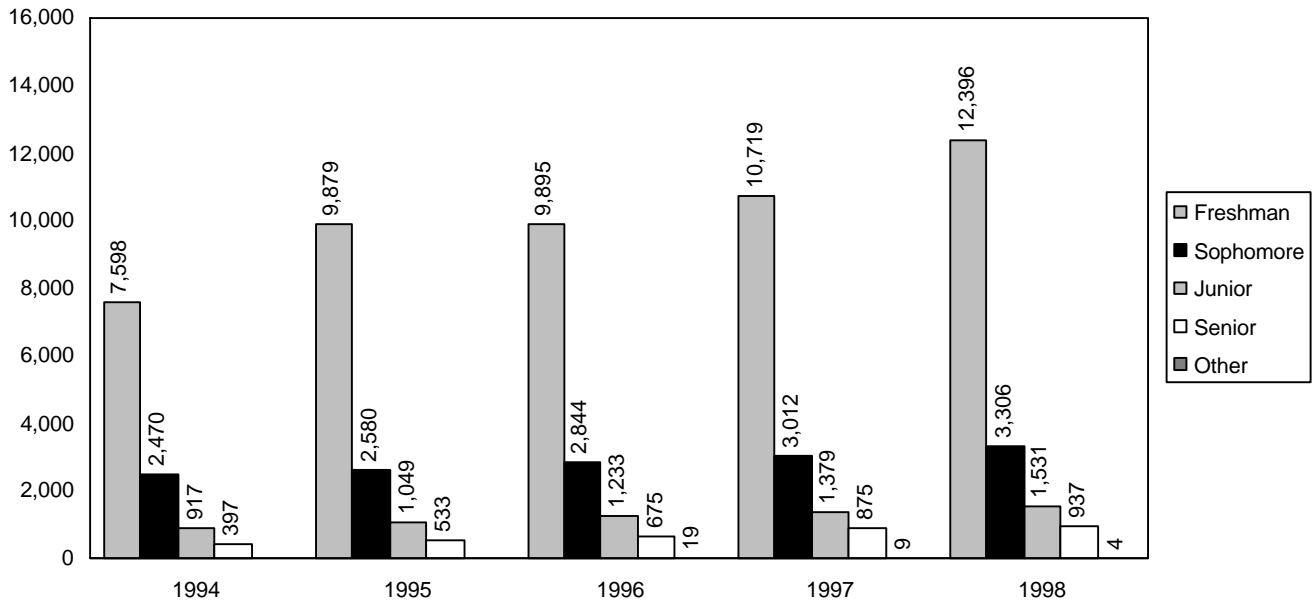
Summer Semester 1994-1998

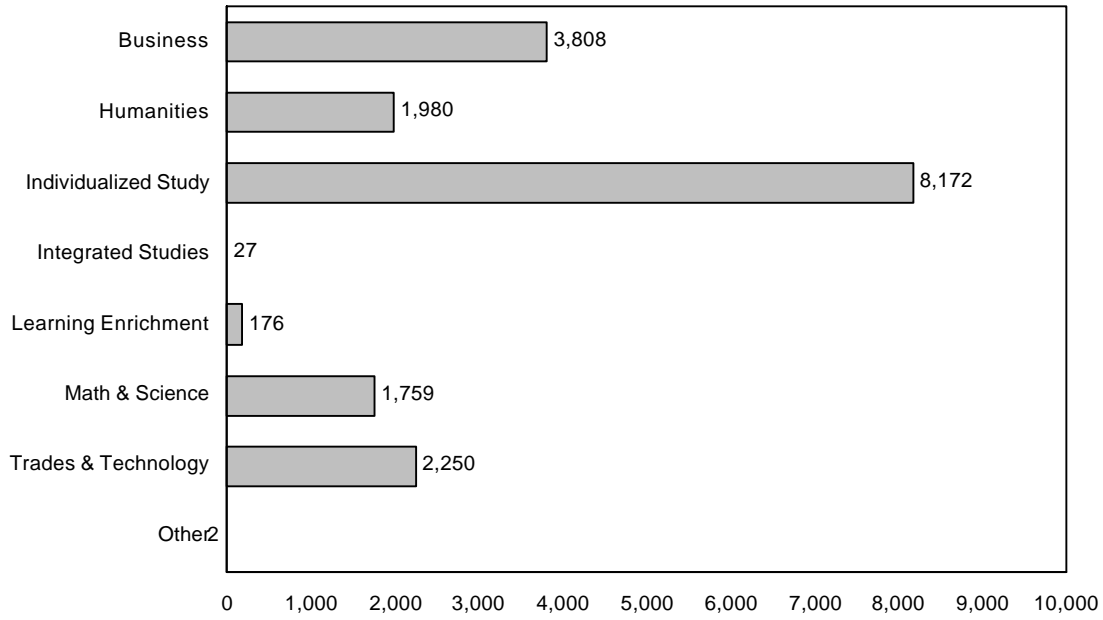

HEADCOUNT BY AREA OF STUDY

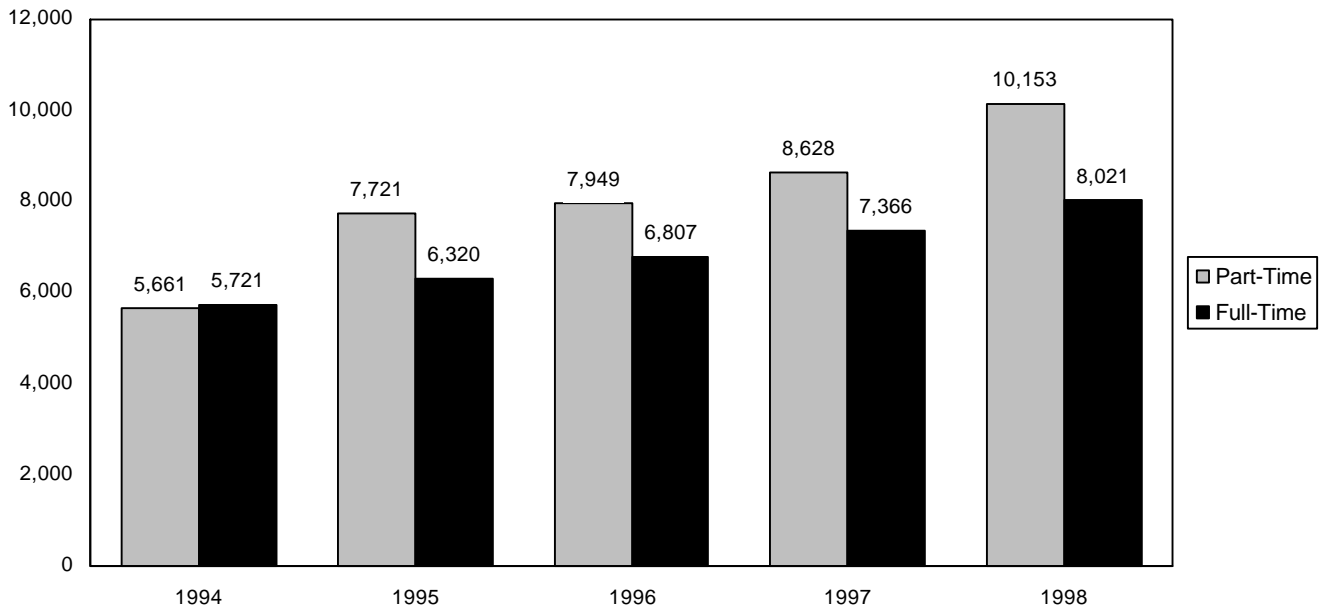

PART-TIME/FULL-TIME HEADCOUNT

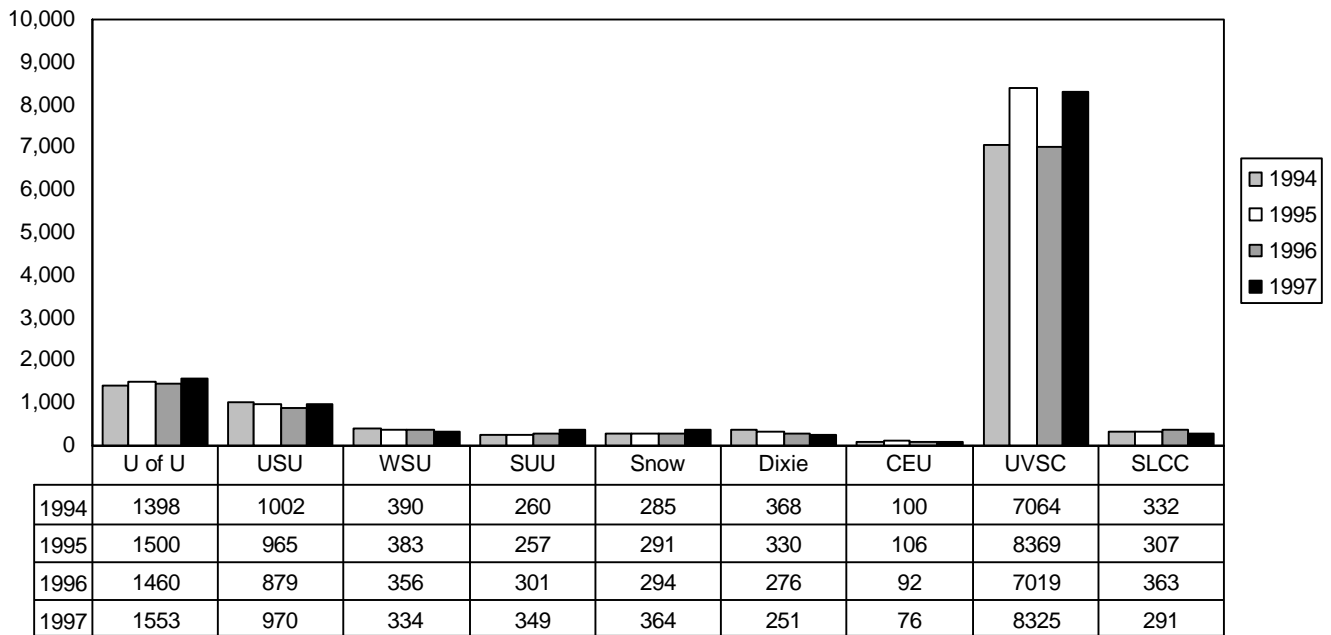

UTAH SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

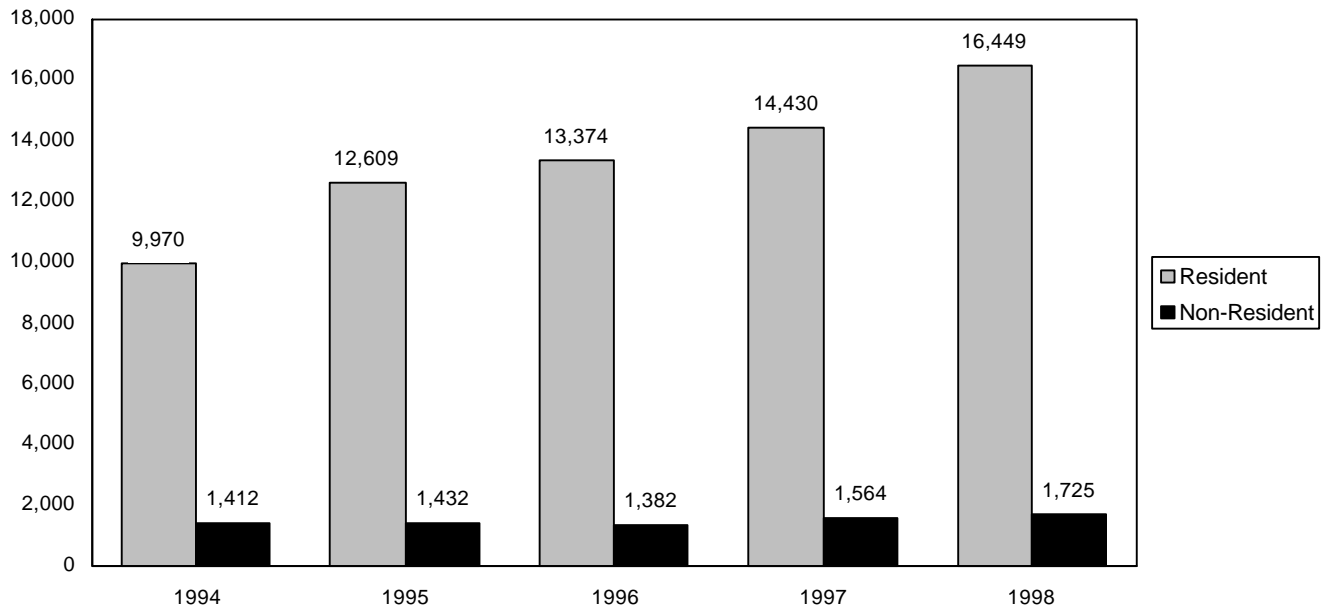
Headcount Enrollment by Utah County Residency

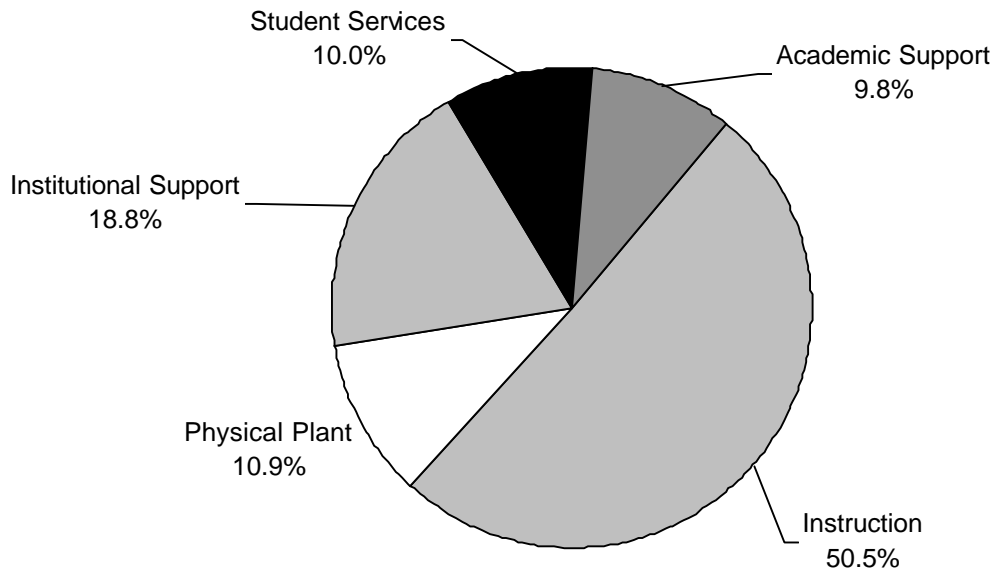

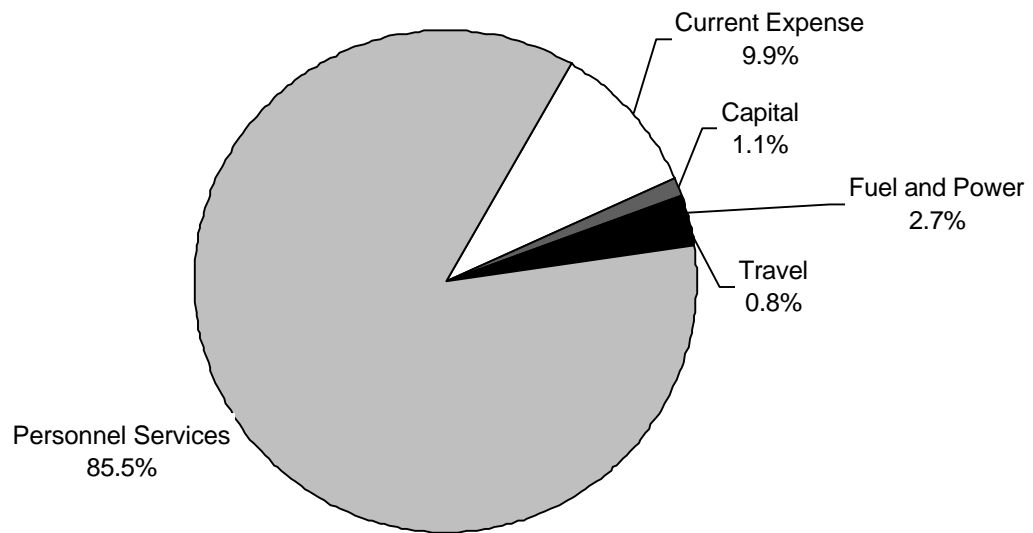

EXPENDITURE PURPOSE 1998-1999**



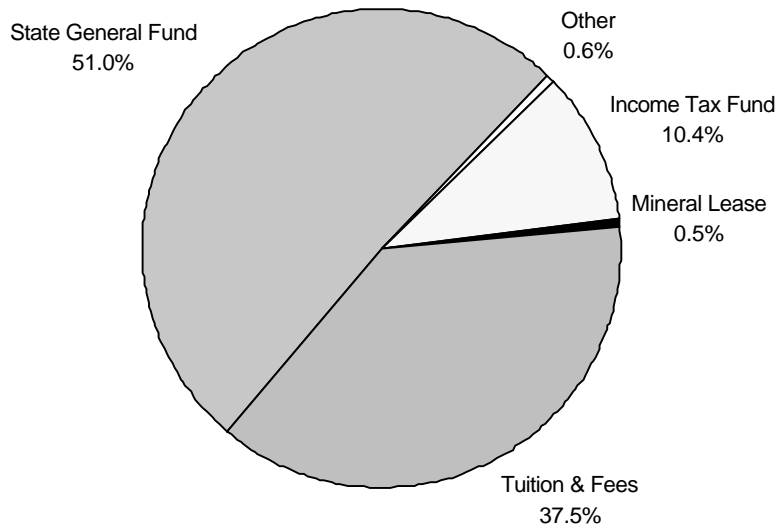
