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Methodology


IR called all non-returning UVU freshmen during what would have been their sophomore year, starting in October 2018 and ending in November 2018.

The call list included 2,056 non-returning students, of whom we spoke to 405 students (19.7% response rate).

We also spoke with 386 parents or other adults speaking on behalf of the students (38.5% total response rate), though these individuals were not asked all survey questions.



Reasons for Leaving UVU





I wanted to gain skills to get a better job.


I wanted to satisfy the requests of my family.

I had some other reason for attending.





Travel to and from campus was easy.


I had friends at UVU.

Money was not a major complication.












Work Status








Living Arrangements







Paying for School





Financial Aid

Of the 123 non-returning students we spoke with who said they could not afford college, 91 said that they applied for financial aid (74.0%).

Of those 91 non-returning students who said they applied for financial aid, 58 said that they accepted the financial aid that was offered (65.9%).

Most Common Reasons to Not Accept a Financial Aid Award (n = 30, multiple responses allowed):

- I didn't want to go into debt to pay for college (60.0%).
- My financial aid award would not cover my costs (36.7%).
- I was not offered any (36.7%).
- The process was too much work or confusing (33.3%).

Most Common Reasons to <u>Not Apply</u> for Financial Aid (n = 31, multiple responses allowed):

- I didn't want to go into debt to pay for college (74.2%).
- I didn't think that I would qualify (54.8%).
- I didn't know how or where to apply (41.9%)
