Thanks to all the teachers for your dedication and the sacrifice of your time to broaden our horizons and make our lives more enjoyable. It is a privilege to continue the motto of “Learning, Doing, and Sharing” this coming year because we weren’t able to finish it last Spring with our scholarship dinner, amazing speakers and entertainment. Hopefully, we’ll use that program this next Spring!

I would like to end with a personal note. When Ruth Hillam asked me to be her Vice-President, I told her that I’d had cancer two years previous. She said that she had had cancer too. After I thought about it for a week, I finally said, “Yes.” Would you believe a month later I had to have another tumor removed from the back of my head and have six weeks of radiation! Two-and-a-half years previous when I had radiation, it completely wiped me out physically and emotionally. However, this time I was able to attend all the Elder Quest classes, and I finished my radiation two days before Thanksgiving with plenty of energy. I attribute my success with my treatments this time to the positive influence generated by you wonderful people. Sorry, I have to wear these hats, but I don’t have hair from the radiation on the back of my head!

Hope you’ll join us this coming semester! As an Elder Quest board, we hope to see you this Fall!

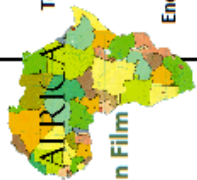

## Zoom Classes - What to Expect

### Getting ready to Zoom:

First, You will need to use either an Apple or Windows computer or a smart device (like a smart phone or tablet) with the Zoom app installed to participate in any of the classes.

If you haven't used Zoom, and need to install it, go to either <https://www.zoom.us> or your app store to download and install it. If you need assistance with this please send a request for help to [elderquestonline@gmail.com](mailto:elderquestonline@gmail.com) to set up a time for help.

We have set up four test classes that you can join to become familiar with using Zoom. We will provide some instruction during these classes on how to use the various features of the program during the classes. They are scheduled for:

- 10 to 11 am on Wed, the 26<sup>th</sup> of Aug,
- 10 to 11 am on Thu, the 27<sup>th</sup> of Aug,
- 1 to 2 pm on Thu, the 27<sup>th</sup> of Aug, and
- 1 to 2 pm on Fri, the 28<sup>th</sup> of Aug.

### Getting ready for Elder Quest Classes:

- Each of the 12 classes offered to members of Elder Quest will have a unique Zoom meeting ID. This meeting ID will be used to attend each of the 10 sessions taught for that class.
- The meeting ID for each class will be emailed to all whose membership has been received during the first week in September. Memberships arriving after that will also receive the class details. We will allow anyone with the meeting ID to join the classes during the first week of classes, but a membership will be required to attend subsequent class sessions. A meeting ID will also be mailed to each member for the scheduled Potpourri Lectures.
- When you join any Elder Quest class you will see a small screen with "Please wait for the host to start this meeting" displayed or a larger screen with "Please wait, the host will let you in soon." displayed. These screens will also display the name of the teacher(s) and the class title and provide a link to "Test Computer Audio".
- Once you are admitted to the class a screen may allow you to "Join with computer audio" before coming into the class.

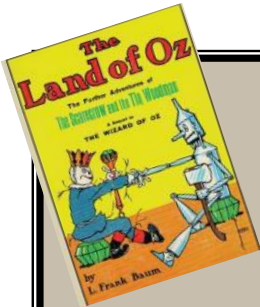
The teachers are allowing us to record each session of their class during this semester so that EQ members that miss a class or want to attend sessions of a class at another time may watch them at any time before the end of the year. The recording for each session of each class will have a unique link which can only be used by the recipient to which it is emailed. You may request to receive a link for these recording by emailing the request to [elderquestonline@gmail.com](mailto:elderquestonline@gmail.com). The classes will become available 2 or 3 days after each session. You will need to be logged into your Youtube account to watch them.

Lewis, world literature, and other topics. His research and writing on Shakespeare has focused on family life as experienced in Shakespeare's time and depicted in the plays. Besides Shakespeare and Lewis, Professor Young's passions include the philosophy of Emmanuel Levinas, a twentieth-century thinker whose ideas have many kinds of relevance to literary study. Among other things, Levinas discusses art, language, history, and culture, but above all "ethics," by which he means the unavoidable relationship each of us has with "the Other" (i.e., the other person). Bruce holds a PhD from Harvard and teaches at BYU. He is also Julia Blair's son-in-law!

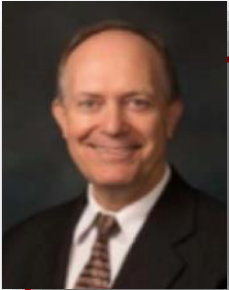
- Sept. 21** *Wounded Tiger* by T. Martin Bennett Dale & Margene Shumway  
This writing is the true story of angry Japanese pilot Mitsuo Fuchida, who led the attack on Pearl Harbor, loved Japan and hated America, but ultimately came to peace with himself and his enemies. An American pilot and family are part of the narrative giving balance to the account.
- Sept. 28** *Tattoos on the Heart* by Greg Boyle Tal Huber  
An exciting memoir written by a Catholic priest, Greg Boyle, in which he relays his experiences while serving as the leader of the Dolores Mission Church in the gang capitol of the world, Los Angeles.
- Oct. 5** *Written out of History* by Senator Mike Lee Ruth Hillam  
Mike Lee indicates that some of those early contributors to our inspired Constitution including women, slaves, and an Iroquois Chief are being forgotten or written out of our history.
- Oct. 12** *The Accidental Tourist* by Anne Tyler Dale & Margene Shumway  
A humorous novel about a travel-guide author who hates traveling. Separated from his wife, he and his distressed dog move in with his zany siblings and he has a relationship with an odd-ball female dog trainer.
- Oct. 19** *The Murder of Roger Ackroid* by Agatha Christie Linda Knight  
How many books has Agatha Christie written? Why is she known as a "Plot Mistress?" Why does Linda Knight love her writing so much? Can you figure out who the murderer is before the last page?

- Nov. 2** *Mother Teresa---an Authorized Biography* by Kathryn Spink Dale & Margene Shumway  
A focus on the simple but impressive woman, raised in the Balkans, but spending her life among the "poorest of the poor" in Calcutta, India, striving to do "something beautiful for Jesus."
- Nov. 9** *The Persian Pickle Club* by Sandra Dallas La Rae Huber  
A group of friends in Depression-era Kansas are tied together with shared interests in quilting, good food, conversation, and keeping secrets.
- Nov. 16** *The Other Side of the Bridge* by Cameron Wright Fran Reiser  
Katie Connelly, a research assistant at the university, is working on a history of the Golden Gate Bridge. With mystery, tragedy, romance, and science, it's hard to put the book down.

We are also looking at the shows at Tuacahn and the Shakespeare Festival. Also, in Cedar City, they have the Neil Simon Festival which presents great plays, so we would like to incorporate those three venues into one trip. It is too early yet to have anything definite in place.

#### Hill Cumorah Pageant & Historic Upstate New York Tour

July 12 -18, 2021

**(This is a Travel Passport Tour and the Board has give us permission to give you a weeks head start before we send it out nationally because so many of you have requested us to do a church history tour. You will receive the tour by email as soon as we have a firm price. Once the bus is full, we have to stop selling!)**

This will be your last and final chance to see the Hill Cumorah Pageant. So don't miss it.

We will do our best to include the Smith Farm, the Sacred Grove, Hill Cumorah, Visitors Center and Top of Hill, Book of Mormon Publication Site, Phelps General store, Historic Palmyra Museum & the Martin Harris Farm.

We will visit the Kirtland Temple and Visitors Site, the 19<sup>th</sup> Century Grist Mill, the Newell K. Whitney store, the Isaac Morley Farm and the Whitney Home, the sawmill and ashery in Kirtland, Ohio. In Pennsylvania, we will be visiting the Priesthood Restoration Site in Susquehanna, Pennsylvania. We will see the Cemetery where Joseph and Emma Smith buried their first child as well as Emma's parents.

So, this is the Mormon Church History part of the tour. We do not want to take you to that beautiful, historic part of the United States without showing you as much of upstate New York as we can.

We will visit Niagara Falls, from the United States Side, and also do the Maid of the Mist to take a boat up close to the Falls on the water. We want to show you Letchworth State Park. This was voted #1, out of 6,000 State Parks, in the United States in 2017.

Seneca Falls is the Home of the Women's Museum and the Women's Hall Of Fame. This is where the Women's movement, for their right to vote, began. We will visit the beautiful "Finger Lakes" of Upstate New York. According to Native American Legend, the lakes were formed when the great Spirit laid his hands on the land to bless it.
