#### Office PA

- -Assist Producers with scheduling, emails, and document organization.
- -Help coordinate logistics: locations, travel, and accommodations.
- -Aid in planning and executing training meetings.
- -Help Communicate with other departments to ensure smooth production communication.
- -Run errands and coordinate deliveries or returns.
- -Support pre-production tasks: auditions, location scouting, and material prep.
- -Assist on set with talent, call sheets, and paperwork.

#### 2nd AD

- -Coordinate talent movement for hair, makeup, wardrobe, and rehearsals.
- -Liaise between departments to ensure smooth production flow.
- -Communicate with the 1st AD about talent status and scheduling issues.
- -Help maintain the shooting schedule and report delays to the 1st AD.
- -Manage on-set break logistics and ensure timely returns.
- -Support set safety and crowd control.
- -Handle paperwork, including talent timecards (Exhibit Gs) and production reports.
- -Create daily call sheets.

#### 2nd 2nd AD

- -Assist with on-set operations, keeping cast and crew informed of schedules and plans.
- -Communicate updates between the 1st and 2nd ADs and other departments.
- -Manage talent movement, coordinating with hair, makeup, and wardrobe.
- -Help with crowd control and maintain order on set.
- -Enforce set protocols and ensure smooth transitions between takes.
- -Support the 1st and 2nd AD with additional tasks as needed.
- -Create daily production reports.

### Script Supervisor (2 Positions Available)

- -Collaborate with the 2nd AC and sound to ensure each slate is correct.
- -Complete detailed script supervisor notes and reports. Ensure they are given digitally to the production team for the editors at the end of each shooting day.
- -Time and record every take.
- -Make continuity notes regarding wardrobe, hair, makeup, props, and the set.
- -Ensure that an actors' eyeline line up, so that once the acne is edited, they appear to be looking at the intended character or object.
- -Record the director's notes and circle-takes

-Note any changes to the script, such as dialogue, which the actors make on set.

## -Locations Manager (2 Positions Available)

- -Scout and present filming locations to the Director and Producers, that fit the film's aesthetic and budget.
- -Work with Producers and Supervising Producer to secure locations with necessary contracts and permits.
- -Manage location logistics, including scheduling and handling special requirements.
- -Liaise with authorities, property owners, and vendors for permits and permissions with Supervising Producer and Producers.
- -Ensure locations are film-ready, coordinating set dressing and site preparations. Understand first in requirements of departments and last out so that all information is coordinated.
- -Manage on-set needs like parking, lunch area, restrooms, and power access, ensuring safety. Determine production supplies, i.e, tables, chairs, heaters, cones, signs, etc.
- -Oversee location wrap-up, returning sites to their original condition and addressing damages.
- -Resolve logistical issues and ensure smooth operations at each location.
- -Provide maps and other location instructions for distribution with the daily call sheet.

## **Set PA (Multiple Positions Available)**

- -Assist the ADs and departments with on-set tasks, equipment setup, and paperwork.
- -Help with set preparation and breakdown, as requested.
- -Run errands for supplies, deliveries, and crew transport.
- -Manage crowd control to keep the set organized and safe.
- -Communicate effectively with all departments to address issues promptly.
- -Perform additional duties as assigned by the ADs.
- -Organize and distribute all walkies to crew.

#### 1st AC

- -Assist the DP with camera prep and setup.
- -Maintain focus throughout the entire production.
- -Organize and maintain camera equipment and lenses. Keep equipment lists.
- -Load/unload camera equipment.
- -Notify producers of any damaged equipment ASAP.

#### 2nd AC

- -Assist the 1st AC with camera prep, setup, and maintenance.
- -Ensure consistent battery charging.
- -Manage and organize media and camera reports. Give camera reports to 2nd AD at the end of the day for production reports.
- -Operate slate for the production
- -Communicate with the Script Supervisors, and the Sound Mixer to ensure each slate is correct.

-Load/unload camera equipment.

#### Camera PA

- -Assist the 1st AC with camera setups, lens swaps, and maintenance.
- -Set up and maintain video village for producers and director.
- -Manage camera expendables.
- -Maintain an accurate camera log.
- -Load/unload camera equipment.

### **Social Media and Marketing Content Creator**

- -Help create content during the pre production, principle photography, and post production phases.
- -Keep up on social media trends.
- -Work closely with the Director and Producers to ensure that the BTS footage aligns with the overall marketing and promotional strategy.

## Still Photographer

- -Capture behind-the-scenes shots of cast, crew, and set activities.
- -Take a large group photo.
- -Collaborate with the Director for a poster photo.
- -Edit and deliver digital photos to the crew.
- -Capture the set's atmosphere and energy authentically.
- -Work discreetly to avoid disrupting the production.

### **BTS Videographer**

- -Capture behind-the-scenes footage of cast, crew, and set activities.
- -Conduct short interviews with cast and crew for insights into the filmmaking process.
- -Collaborate with the Director and Producers to align BTS footage with marketing strategies.
- -Edit footage into engaging clips for social media and promotions.
- -Capture the set's atmosphere and energy authentically.
- -Work discreetly to avoid disrupting the production.

### **Key Grip**

- -Oversee the setup and operation of grip equipment with the G&E mentor.
- -Work with the Gaffer to ensure proper lighting and rigging.
- -Manage and coordinate grip crew.
- -Ensure the safe and efficient setup of all grip gear.
- -Notify producers of any equipment issues/damages ASAP.

#### Gaffer

- -Design and execute the lighting plan in collaboration with the DP and G&E mentor.
- -Set up and manage lighting equipment.

- -Oversee lighting crew and equipment maintenance.
- -Notify producers of any equipment issues/damages ASAP.

## **G&E** (Multiple Positions Available)

- -Assist the Gaffer with Lighting setup and adjustments.
- -Assist the Key Grip with Grip equipment set up and adjustments.
- -Ensure all grip and electric gear are maintained and organized.
- Keep track of all expendables.

## **Costume Designer**

- -Collaborate with the Director and Costume Mentor to develop costumes that align with the film's vision.
- -Create mood boards to present costume concepts.
- -Source and manage all costumes and accessories.
- -Ensure costume continuity and track changes across scenes.
- -Conduct fittings and maintain costumes during filming.
- -Keep an organized inventory of costumes and related materials.
- -Manage budget and keep track of spending and receipts. Make all returns and close out account within one week of shoot.

## **Production Designer (2 Positions Available)**

- -Develop and execute the visual style and design of the set with the help of the Production Design Mentor.
- -Collaborate with the Director and other department to create a cohesive look.
- -Source and organize all set pieces.
- -Arrive to set on time ready to dress the set before actors and camera.
- -Oversee the construction, decoration, and arrangement of key set pieces.
- -Ensure continuity of set dec across scenes, monitoring placement and usage to maintain consistency throughout the film.
- -Manage budget and keep track of spending and receipts. Make all returns and close out account within one week of shoot.

## **Props Specialist**

- -Collaborate with the Director and Production Designer to determine required props.
- -Research, source, and create props fitting the film's setting and characters.
- -Maintain a detailed inventory of props and ensure availability during shooting.
- -Ensure prop continuity and consistency across scenes.
- -Coordinate prop logistics on set, ensuring readiness and proper use by actors.
- -Manage budget and keep track of spending and receipts. Make all returns and close out account within one week of shoot.

### Hair and Makeup PA

- -Collaborate with the Director and HMU Mentor to create visual looks.
- -Work with the Director and Script Supervisor to ensure Continuity of talent's hair and makeup.
- -Perform touch-ups throughout the day, specifically on call for last looks.
- -Manage budget and keep track of spending and receipts.

#### **Sound Mixer**

- -Set up and operate set sound mixing.
- -Place lavaliers on actors.
- -Monitor and capture high-quality audio during the shoot.
- -Collaborate with the director and other departments to ensure optimal sound conditions.
- -Collaborate with Boom Operator to ensure high-quality audio.

### **Boom Operator**

- -Set up and operate the boom on set.
- -Place lavaliers on actors.
- -Capture high-quality audio during the shoot with boom placement.
- -Collaborate with the director and DP to ensure no boom in the frame.
- -Collaborate with a sound mixer to ensure high-quality audio.

### **Craft Services/Catering Specialist**

- -Source snacks and beverages for the shoot.
- -Handle catering logistics for lunch.
- -Set up and maintain the craft services table, ensuring it is stocked and organized.
- -Replenish items and keep the area clean throughout the day.
- -Offer diverse options to accommodate dietary restrictions.
- -Manage the craft services budget and track spending and receipts. Close out account within one week of shoot.

#### DIT

- -Collaborate with mentors and manage the data workflow for all digital footage captured during production.
- -Ingest, back up, and organize footage to ensure a smooth post-production process.
- -Monitor and maintain the quality of on-set camera feeds and recordings.
- -Troubleshoot any technical issues related to cameras, media, and equipment during shoots.
- -Generate daily reports (dailies) for review by the creative team.
- -Ensure all footage is securely backed up and archived on hard drives.
- -Ensure footage is given to editing hand-off on last day of production.

#### **Post Production Colorist**

- -Collaborate with the Director and Cinematographer to align with the film's vision.
- -Perform color grading to ensure consistency and achieve the desired look.
- -Use software like DaVinci Resolve or Adobe Premiere Pro to enhance color balance and contrast.
- -Apply color correction techniques to resolve footage issues.
- -Deliver final graded versions in required formats.
- -Offer feedback during post-production for a polished result.

## **Post Production Sound Mixer**

- -Collaborate with the Director and Mentor to shape the film's soundscape.
- -Mix dialogue, sound effects, and music for a balanced audio experience.
- -Edit and clean audio tracks for clarity and consistency.
- -Implement enhancements and corrections for technical issues.
- -Design and integrate sound effects.
- -Prepare and deliver final audio mixes in required formats.
- -Participate in reviews and make adjustments as needed.
- -Meet post-production deadlines for festival submission.

## **Assistant Composer**

- -Collaborate with the Director, Producers, and Mentor to grasp the film's musical themes and tone.
- -Work with a composer and help to contribute to the process that enhances the narrative and character development.
- -Create diverse musical styles for specific scenes and emotions.
- -Edit and arrange music to fit the film's pacing.
- -Integrate the score with sound design and final audio mix.
- -Deliver high-quality audio files in required formats.
- -Adjust based on feedback and meet post-production deadlines.
