Accreditation Update: Kat provided an update on the ongoing accreditation process, emphasizing the importance of faculty participation in the faculty meeting with the accreditors. She mentioned that accreditation occurs once every seven years and urged faculty to partake in the process and make their voices heard.

Equitable Access/Flat Fee for Textbooks/apps Cameron Archibald, Louise Bridge, Parker Smith

The Equitable Access fee is a flat fee of \$250 per semester, covering all textbooks for students. This fee is automatically applied, but students have the option to opt out within the first week of classes.

The communication plan for informing students includes multiple emails, website updates, and information in Canvas to ensure students are aware of their options and the opt-out process.

Part-time students are automatically enrolled but can opt out. Graduate students and certain programs like concurrent enrollment are not included in the \$250 fee and will use the a la carte option.

Summer semester is \$150 for the summer course or \$300 if they take 1st and 2nd block courses.

Academic Programs and Assessment, Laurie Sharp

Writing Enriched: The Writing Enriched (WE) committee, a faculty-led committee, previously lacked administrative support from the Provost's office. It will not have a dotted line to Laurie Sharp. The committee's bylaws were outdated and misplaced. Updating these bylaws and establishing assessment structures is essential to sustain the committee's efforts to make 2 WE courses a graduation requirement for bachelor's degrees.

Some students missed taking the required WE courses, affecting degree conferral. Laurie reviewed the catalog and noted WE course requirements were missing. The goal is to ensure accurate catalog entries for clarity and compliance. The WE requirement will be formally included in the catalog, effective Fall 2025.

Action Steps:

- The committee will work on updating the bylaws and assessment structure.
- Masood, as the new chair, will seek Faculty Senate ratification for the updated bylaws.
- Support for the committee will come from Laurie's team, ensuring assessment of WE requirements aligns with graduation policies.
