Sam Elzinga – Eurasian Insights Conference

Sam Elzinga, a UVU graduate, presented his senior thesis: *The Central Asian Regional Security Complex Revisited: Understanding the Implications of Shifting Regional Dynamics*, at Eurasian Insights: Strengthening Central Asian Studies Conference on Politics, History and Society in Ghent, Belgium on September 22-24, 2021. Elzinga argued that Central Asian nations must engage with Afghanistan in the future, regardless of whether they wish to or not.
