<u>Overview</u> A required course in the UVU Honors Program curriculum, Colloquium engages students in a series of class sessions centered on a theme, as well as intellectually and culturally enriching events both on and off campus. This term's theme is WIRED, so we'll engage in a series of class sessions that help us understand how humans are wired neurologically, genetically, psychologically, and culturally, as well as how technology and artificial intelligence impact us.

Students will complete three choice events and one group experience, plus attend any one or more sessions of the Utah Conference on Undergraduate Research. Students will also complete discussions of, assigned readings, as well as graded reading quizzes. Attending and responding to self-selected lectures, exhibits, theatrical and musical performances, immersive experiences, daylong and overnight outdoor education trips, as well as service activities, will also be graded work for the course.

Course Objectives

The main objectives of this class are to: (1) introduce students to excellence in cultural expression in Utah and beyond; (2) develop an appreciation for a multiplicity of cultural expressions; (3) foster an intellectually engaged community among UVU Honors students.

- 2. Sign and return the mandatory Activity Participation Form. This is an Adobe Sign form easily accessible electronically.
- 3. Watch the CHAMP training videos and **follow the make-up and cancellation policies** for events as indicated on CHAMP
- 4. Sign up on CHAMP for **one GROUP EXPERIENCE by Friday**, **January 12** and participate during the semester. These are all designated with the word GROUP in the event title.
- 5. Sign up on CHAMP for three CHOICE EVENTS by Friday, January 12 and participate in them during the semester. Group events beyond your first one may also count as Choice events.
- 6. Participate posted Discussions by listening, thinking, and responding to ideas in the readings, videos, podcasts, and/or writing assignments.
- 7. Attend your Ambassador Check-In Meetings on or by assigned class days. Each Ambassador will notify students in their pod of the format for this check in, which might be an individual meeting, a group activity, or a group meeting.
- 8. Turn in an event response (uploaded via Canvas) within 10 days after each choice or group event to earn full credit. See assignment on Canvas for acceptable response formats. Late responses accepted at 50% credit.
- 9. **Students NEW TO HONORS THIS TERM**: Attend one of the program orientation sessions in the Honors Lounge
- 10. **Students NEW TO HONORS THIS TERM** and who have MORE THAN 70 college credits, make an appointment with Kate to make a plan for success in Honors.

<u>ACADEMIC DISHONESTY:</u> Any dishonesty regarding event participation or attendance may result in failing the course and risk being expelled from the Honors Program. Each student must compose an original response for each choice or group event attended. Al generated responses are disallowed. Each response will require some personal reflection from you.

<u>AI STATEMENT:</u> All programs are not a replacement for your human creativity, originality, and critical thinking, which are the cornerstones of your work as an Honors student. Writing, thinking, and researching are crafts that you must develop over time. At the same time, you should learn how to use AI and in what instances AI can be helpful to you.

The use of generative AI tools (e.g. ChatGPT, Google Bard, etc.) is permitted in this course for the following activities:

- Brainstorming and refining your ideas;
- Fine tuning your research questions;
- Finding information on your topic (although Googling a reliable source or even Wikipedia is better for this);

- Drafting an outline to organize your thoughts; and
- Checking grammar and style.

The use of generative AI tools is not permitted in this course for the following activities:

- Impersonating you in classroom contexts, such as
 - using the tool to compose discussion board prompts
 - o using the tool to compose responses assigned to you
 - o using the tool to create content that you put into a Teams/Canvas chat.
- Writing a draft of a writing assignment.
- Writing entire sentences, paragraphs or papers to complete class assignments.

You are responsible for the information you submit based on an AI query (for instance, that it does not violate intellectual property laws, or contain misinformation or unethical content). Your use of AI tools must be properly documented and cited in order to stay within university policies on academic honesty. Please visit the Writing Center if you need support about how to cite an AI tool.

Any student work submitted using AI tools should clearly indicate what work is the student's work and what part is generated by the AI.

ATHLETICS: Students may attend any UVU athletics event at no charge using their UVU ID. Each event counts as one Choice event. Bring a friend and wear your green gear! Responses should be a selfie at the game, plus a lively description of one moment from it.

ATTENDANCE: This is a participation-based class, so attendance in class and at events is the key.

- 1. Students must attend Monday classes and take the attendance quiz. Students may have TWO absences with no penalty. THREE absences will earn a 70% for attendance, with each additional absence deducting 10%. Habitual or repeated late arrivals and early departures disrupt class and thus will also incur penalties.
- 2. **Please do NOT attend if you are sick**. Please complete the Attendance Alternative Discussion(s) on Canvas. See Kate with guestions or concerns.
- 3. Attendance for events is verified via attendance taken at the event by the event leader on CHAMP AND by a response paper submitted online. Failure to submit a response paper will result in a penalty to the student's final grade, even if the event is attended.

EVENTS:

<u>Signing Up for CHAMP:</u> It's all managed on the CHAMP web app. Set up your account and use it to sign up, get on waitlists or in a lottery, or to cancel for an event during the cancelation window.

Adding and Dropping: It's all managed on the CHAMP web app.

- 1. Add events or groups that have unlimited openings (General), defined slots (Ticketed), or register for a lottery event (Lottery) using the screens on CHAMP.
- 2. Students should keep commitments made during sign-ups, but missing a non-ticketed/free event is not a problem and there are no restrictions on when you can drop. Simply drop it using CHAMP and select another event on the calendar and substitute it.
- **3.** Each ticketed event will have a drop date indicated on CHAMP, **generally ONE WEEK PRIOR to the date of the event**. To drop after that point, you must receive permission from Tiffany Nez.
- **4.** Please note that if you want to drop an event and no wait list exists, **you may be charged for the ticket** unless you can locate another Honors student to attend in your place.
- **5.** For <u>last minute cancelations (less than 24 hours prior</u>), students must be able to produce official documentation (a doctor's note, jury selection notice, police report, etc.) and will be responsible for reimbursing the Honors Program for the cost of the ticket. Please note that work schedules or notes from employers are not a valid cancelation excuse.
- **6.** Missed <u>choice events can be made up by attending another choice event</u> on the Colloquium calendar. Note the sign up and drop dates on each event are different.
- 7. A small list of additional, To Be Announced choice events will be posted on Canvas in mid-October.

8. Make-ups for Group Activities are not permitted. Any student whose plans change may substitute 8+ hours of volunteer service with the same community organization. See the Groups assignment in Canvas for details.

<u>Wait Lists</u>: It's all managed on the CHAMP web app. Limited spots exist for many Colloquium events, but particularly for ticketed events, including Groups. CHAMP records your time-stamped sign-ups and will allocate slots to students on this wait list in order. You may drop an event to which you are added if it is within the drop window.

NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENTS AND MINORS: The UVU Honors Program acknowledges the needs of our non-traditional students regarding Colloquium. Please let Kate know via email if you meet one or more of the following criteria:

- 1. Older than the age of 24
- 2. Working full-time while enrolled (verification requested)
- 3. Are a single parent, have dependents *other than a spouse*, or act as a primary caregiver to an elder or person with a disability
- 4. Left high school without a diploma

If you have concerns due to your non-traditional status, we may arrange alternative assignments for you.

Minors: If you are under age 18, restrictions regarding off-campus activities exist due to university policy. Please contact Kate or Tiffany for more details and alternative arrangements.

DISCUSSION POSTS: Compose an original 150–200-word response to the reading—its content, ideas, connections, etc. Keep your focus on how the reading's content connects to your personal experience.

- This must be completed prior to the in-class discussion to receive full credit.
- You must also <u>respond to at least two other students in your Ambassador Pod</u> to receive full credit.
- Late posts/responses receive 50% credit.

RESPONSES TO EVENTS: Students must submit an **original** response to each Group Experience or Choice Event. Late responses accepted at 50% credit. Please write eloquently and correctly.

Responses may take one of the following forms. You may choose different forms for different events.

- A strong paragraph or two (about 200 words) about why you chose this event, a few details you particularly remember from it, what feelings or learning it evoked in you, and why you would or would not recommend it to other UVU Honors students. You may include other information in your reflection if you choose.
- A 2-3 minute *video recording of you* discussing why you chose this event, something you particularly remember from it, what feelings or learning it evoked in you, and why you would or would not recommend it to other UVU Honors students. You may include other information in your reflection if you choose.
- An audio or video recording of you discussing the event for ~5 minutes with another student (or students) who attended it with you. Each student must state their name in the recording. Ask each other questions about the event, what struck people about it, and whether they would recommend it to other UVU Honors students. Other questions may also be included. Students who complete this together may all submit the same recording.
- A handwritten set of notes or sketches from the event, scanned and submitted as a PDF.
- A photograph of you at the event (alone or with other students) accompanied by one paragraph vivid description of about 100 words from one moment from it. Please write eloquently and correctly. (This is an especially good choice for live theater, music, or sporting events). Students who complete this together may all submit the same photograph but must write original paragraphs.
- Other types of original responses may be submitted with prior approval from Kate or Tiffany.
