




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


LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR





Interlibrary Loan

Interlibrary loan (ILL) is a valuable free service offered by Fulton Library, enabling UVU students, faculty, and staff to request items not available in our collection. Users can obtain digital copies of articles and book chapters or borrow physical books from other libraries, which is one of students' favorite services in the library.

Al Workshops and Research Guides

Artificial intelligence is the hot topic right now. To help students cut through the confusion, Fulton Library planned several AI workshops and created a new AI guide for students. Fulton Library also worked with UVU's AI taskforce to leverage AI innovations responsibly, securely, ethically, and inclusively. One of Fulton's instructional librarians was then able to present on utilizing AI at UVU's Summer University.





Sutherland Archives Hosts Traveling Black History Exhibit



Social Media Goes Viral

A highlight of our social media content was the viral "Study Room" reel, designed to promote our "Ask a Librarian" service and study room reservations. Using a trending audio clip from "Scream Queens," we depicted a satirical take on a common library scenario: a student finding someone in their reserved study room. The video included links to our services, encouraging students to connect with librarians and make reservations. This funny, relatable take on a library service resonated widely with our audience, resulting in 11 million views, 728,000 likes, and 3,700 new followers, significantly enhancing the library's profile within our university community.

Equipment Checkout Upgrades


The library is known for its cozy study spots and thousands of books, but the equipment checkout for current students was one of the most popular resources at Fulton. The library offers free checkouts of everything from cameras and speakers to laptops and telescopes—the library has the tools students need to start a new hobby or ace a class. Some new additions this year include an organic chemistry kit, Cricut machine, and a light box. The most popular items were "desk equipment" checkouts like study supplies, phone chargers, and skeletons.

STRATEGIC OBJECT

SERVICES

Our administration is focused on creating a flexible and cohesive workforce by developing an hourly positions plan that aligns job duties across library departments for greater operational efficiency. We will conduct regular training to ensure all librarians understand AI concepts and their applications in library services. Additionally, we are finalizing plans to transition from our media collection to streaming resources and phase out the map collection. To support students, we will develop instructional materials that help navigate AI tools for academic research and create an action plan for Concurrent Enrollment faculty and students, all while enhancing awareness of library services through a new marketing campaign.

SPACES

We are committed to improving the library environment by documenting accessible seating options and optimizing our expanded archival spaces through reorganization of exhibits and reading areas. An evaluation of our space needs will establish priorities for future enhancements, ensuring a better experience for students. To facilitate navigation, we will implement a comprehensive wayfinding strategy and assess space usage in Technical Services for improved workflows and efficiency.









IVES & PRIORITIES

RESOURCES

In our efforts to enhance resource management, we will implement a new electronic resource management system to streamline the acquisition and organization of digital resources. A pilot centralized-acquisition process will be tested, alongside an evaluation of shelving for the score collection to improve user access. We will develop a sustainable funding plan for our laptop loan program and enhance database subscriptions by introducing new statewide resources while evaluating existing ones. Additionally, we will explore future directions for hosting library tutorials and assess the impact of database changes on user experiences.

Connection to UVU 2030

Fulton Library's strategic plan objectives closely align with Utah Valley University's Vision 2030 plan. The service objective primarily supports UVU's initiative of completion through comprehensively designed curriculum and services. Through our space objective, we assess and remove barriers at every stage of the student life cycle, providing a welcoming environment and technology to enhance student learning. Similarly, the resource objective of supporting curriculum, promoting student success, and removing access barriers aligns with multiple Vision 2023 initiatives. At all levels of Fulton Library planning, we seek to uplift, enhance, and promote Utah Valley University's vision of development and student success.











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
