# **Applied Behavior Analysis**

Empowering the student through knowledge, preparation, and ethics

The applied behavior analysis emphasis will prepare students to work with individuals with autism spectrum disorder and other neurodevelopmental disabilities. Students will complete 27 credits of coursework and at least 1,500 hours of concentrated supervised fieldwork. After completing these hours and meeting additional requirements as set forth by the Association for Behavior Analysis International (ABAI), graduates will be eligible to take the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) examination.

Applied behavior analysis students have a unique opportunity to work with the team at the Melisa Nellesen Center for Autism at UVU. The center provides engaged learning opportunities with laboratory classrooms that operate as practicum sites for some students in the ABA program. These top-tier resources ensure that graduates enjoy a strong start to their career by preparing them to make a difference in the lives of many.

### **Applied Behavior Analysis Degree Overview**

- 35 credits of coursework
- Additional elective available on advanced applications of Applied Behavior Science
- A six-semester program designed with summer and evening coursework for working individuals
- 1,500 hours of clinical fieldwork at an approved practicum site
- Coursework and fieldwork experiences required to apply for the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) certification exam



#### **Admission Requirements**

- Verification of a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- A cumulative minimum GPA of 3.0 or a GPA of 3.0 for the last 60 credits of university coursework
- Three professional letters of recommendation

- A successful interview with the School of Education Graduate Committee
- Submission of complete graduate application and admissions essa

#### **Continuance and Graduation Requirements**

- Complete all program hours (35)
- Complete all courses with a grade of B- or higher
- Maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher

- Complete 1,500 hours of documented clinical fieldwork
- Complete courses and project requirements within five years

#### Licensure

The ABAI has approved the UVU ABA course sequence as meeting the coursework required to take the Board Certified Behavior Analyst examination. Applicants will need to meet additional requirements to apply.
