School Counseling Practicum

Practicum is a 100-hour field experience that occurs during the spring semester of a student's first year in the program.

School Counseling Internship

An internship is a 600-hour field experience that occurs during the final year of the program across two academic semesters.



Admission Requirements

- Verification of a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- A cumulative minimum GPA of 3.0 or a GPA of 3.0 for the last 60 credits of university coursework
- Three professional references who will provide recommendations through the application portal
- Successful interview with the School of Education Graduate
- Submission of complete graduate application and admissions

Continuance and Graduation Requirements

- Complete all program hours (51)
- Complete all courses with a grade of B- or higher
- Maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Successfully complete all practicum and internship experiences required by UVU and the USBE
- Courses and project requirements must be completed within five years

Licensure

Successful graduates who pass the Praxis with the required qualifying score will be eligible for professional licensure as a school counselor in the state of Utah.
