The Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) in secondary education is designed *for individuals who have taken* all required endorsement coursework in one of the following areas and wish to qualify for teacher licensure through the Utah State Board of Education (USBE).

Art and Design Business/Marketing Earth Science History/Social Studies Physical Education Spanish
ASL and Deaf Studies Chemistry English Math Physics
Biology Dance Health Music Theater

Please note: Applicants must have completed a USBE-approved education methods course in their content area prior to their student teaching in secondary education.



Admission Requirements

- Verification of a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution in a recognized content area for which UVU can recommend a secondary teaching license.
- A grade of C or higher for all coursework required by the USBE, and minimum 3.0 GPA for the last 60 credits of undergraduate work.
- Submission of complete graduate application and essay
- Three professional references who will provide recommendations through the application portal
- A successful interview with the School of Education Graduate Committee
- A successful background check through the USBE

Graduation Requirements

- Complete all courses with a grade of B- or higher / GPA 3.0 or higher
- A minimum of 20 graduate credit hours must be completed in the graduate program.
- Complete courses and project requirements within six years
- Graduate credits accepted from another regionally accredited institution shall have been completed within four years of matriculation into the graduate program and cannot be older than six years at the time of graduation with a master's degree.
