BSN Completion Curriculum Outline

All BSN Nursing classes are offered face to face or online. Classes can be taken in any order, and students can attend full or part time. Acceptance to UVU is required. Apply to UVU at https://www.uvu.edu/admissions/. Students must meet both requirements for UVU and the Department of Nursing to qualify for graduation with a BSN. Students not in the UVU Nursing program will also need to apply to the UVU RN-BSN Nursing Program. For UVU RN-BSN Nursing application information see: https://www.uvu.edu/nursing/degrees/bsn.html.

Seamless transition into BSN completion courses is only an option after graduating from the UVU ASN program and receiving an RN license. Registration after one semester of BSN nursing courses will be contingent upon having received an RN license. BSN completion program classes can be taken in any order, full or part-time, and online or face-to-face. A grade of C or better is required in each BSN core class. Only classes indicated below can be taken before ASN graduation.

*APPROVED NURSING ELECTIVE HOURS: 5 Credits

The BSN degree requires 5 credit hours of approved Nursing Elective credit hours.

All or at least 2 credit hours of the required 5 Nursing Elective credit hours must be upper division nursing classes from the Approved Nursing Elective Classes List. If needed, other Nursing Elective credit hours may be taken from the Approved Non-Nursing Classes List.

NURS 490R Special Topics in Nursing - limit of 4 credit hours can be applied toward elective hours.

NURS 495R Independent Study in Nursing - limit of 3 credit hours can be applied toward elective hours.

NURS 4540 Research & Theory in Nursing Practice

Prerequisite of a university-level statistics course with a C grade or higher.

NURS 4325 Nursing in the Community Clinical

This class must be taken concurrently with NURS 4320; both classes are online. NURS 4325 Nursing in the Community Clinical requires 45 hours of community service, which may include working in a community-based nursing setting, engaging in a community teaching project, and providing community service of the student's choice with instructor approval. These clinical hours must be completed while registered for NURS 4320 & 4325, not before or after. Specific details about the clinical hours needed and any questions regarding the NURS 4325 clinical course requirements should be directed to the clinical faculty responsible for the course.

Until matriculated in BSN completion program, all requirements are subject to change without notice or obligation.

Responsibility for satisfying all requirements rests upon the student. Students should use Wolverine Track to monitor their graduation requirements.
