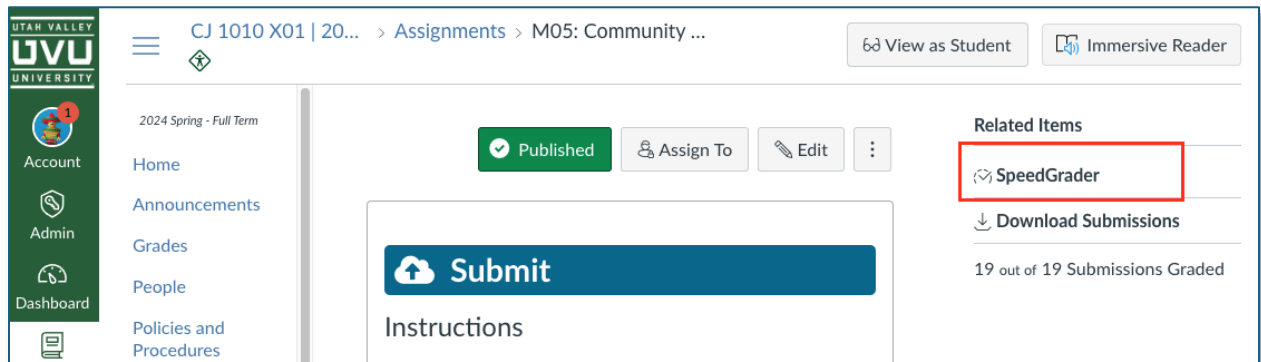


# Copyleaks Similarity Report

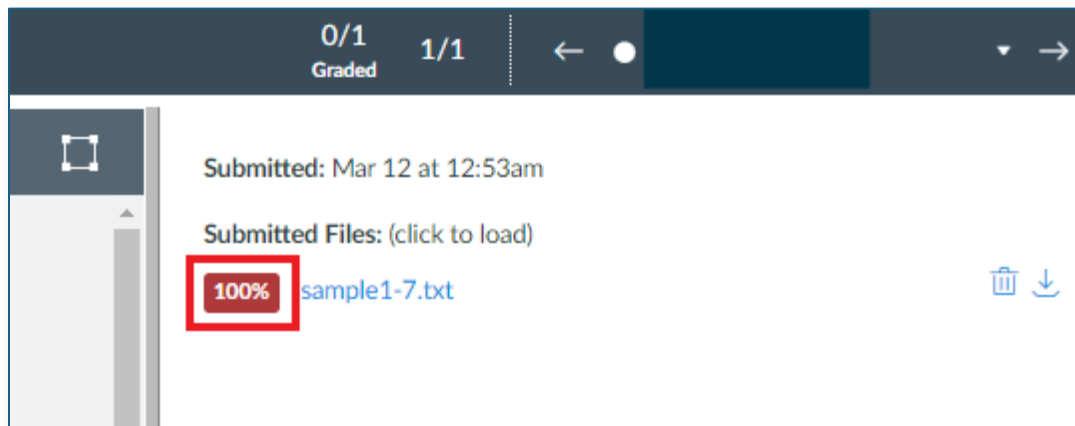
According to Copyleaks, “With our Similarity Report, you can view your document's overall percentage of similar content. Additionally, we separate similar content into 3 categories: Identical, Minor Changes, and Paraphrased.”

To utilize your Canvas course’s Copyleaks Similarity Report, follow these steps:

1. Navigate to the assignment where Copyleaks is used.
2. Find the SpeedGrader tool on the page and open it.



3. When looking at a student submission, the Copyleaks report summary should appear as a percentage in the right-hand margin. The percentage should appear in a clickable box;



4. After clicking on the box, the report should appear in a new browser tab:

If a student's similarity report is still generating, you will notice a 'pending clock' icon next to the student's submission as well as in SpeedGrader. The clock icon will be replaced by a percentage in a box once the similarity report has fully generated.

If Copyleaks fails to generate a similarity report, the student's submission will have an exclamation point icon instead of a clock or a percentage. The icon will show up in the student's submission and in SpeedGrader.
