



## S.A. Reallocations & Efficiencies



## Reallocations from 2021-2022 = \$164,564

- Converted part-time to full-time positions to reduce turnover
- Utilized vacancies to address pay inequities and reduce turnover
- Reallocated funds from the LEAD appropriated budget to create a PT Digital Outreach Specialist (CSI)
- Reallocated funds from the LEAD appropriated budget to for Athletics Therapist operating budget
- Reallocated funds from the SR&A appropriated budget to fund PT position
- Reallocated funds throughout IE to address multiple reorgs and position needs

## Sample of Efficiencies

- Multiple departments are serving significant increases in students with no new staff or resources
- Improved processes, cross-training, and resources reduced transfer credit evaluation from 5 weeks to 3 days
- CampusLogic reduced FAFSA verification from 6 weeks to 3-4 days
- Accessibility Services moved from 2-month wait to a maximum of a 1-week wait, increasing access for students to receive necessary accommodations supporting their persistence and completion
- Multiple departments have been re-organized to achieve greater efficiency and use of resources (Registrar, Admissions, Multicultural, Accessibility Services, Women's Success Center)
- Accessibility Services decreased student wait times from 2 months to 1 week while increasing students served







The Department of Student Leadership and Involvement (SLI) facilitates opportunities that enhance the academic  $experience\ by\ promoting\ student\ involvement\ and\ event\ attendance,\ developing\ leadership\ skills,\ and\ preparing\ students$ to take on active societal roles on campus and in their communities.

 $\stackrel{-}{\text{SLI}}$  accomplishes this mission by designing learning opportunities for students to grow and develop as an individual while working with their peers, staff, faculty, administrators, and community professionals. Because students engaged with our department, they will be able to do one or more of the following:

- Describe the purpose of the SLI program in which they are participating in and discuss the impact it has within
