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### Course Description

For non-native Spanish speakers who, as a result of foreign residency or similar exposure to the language, have attained a fairly good mastery of basic Spanish. Overviews the basic grammar of Spanish with special emphasis on major concepts, i.e., mastery of verb forms, object pronouns, preterit vs. imperfect, use of the subjunctive, etc. (Approximately 20% of the course, which is fairly fast paced, is dedicated to the study of literature and culture. Individuals who prefer a slower-paced approach should consider taking SPAN 3030 and SPAN 3040, which together will be somewhat equivalent to SPAN 3050.).

La **asistencia** es diaria con la asignación preparada a fin de participar activamente en clase.

Las páginas asignadas se deberán leer y estudiar completamente.

Los **ejercicios** gramaticales se vencen antes de la clase en la fecha indicada en el horario. El estudiante deberá

escribir las respuestas de los ejercicios gramaticales asignados y entregarlos por CANVAS en la fecha y

horario ya fijado. Se recibe crédito por completar los ejercicios, sin importar cuántos errores haya. En

clase hablaremos de las respuestas. *Toda tarea entregada tarde valdrá solo la mitad de los puntos.* Se

recomienda hacer uso de los ejercicios adicionales en el texto, ya que algunos puntos gramaticales

necesitarán de práctica extra.

Las **asignaciones de literatura** deberán ser leídas con anticipación según la lectura fijada en el horario. Estas

lecturas se presentan y analizan a base de preguntas y respuestas. Los estudiantes son responsables de estar preparados para participar activamente en debates literarios. Las lecturas literarias se usan para destacar puntos de gramática y cultura, así como para incrementar el vocabulario. Puede haber pruebitas para constatar que el alumno se preparó.

Las **pruebitas** de literatura u otras en clase serán dadas a discreción del profesor. *No hay pruebas tarde.* Cualquier tipo de engaño será tratado a discreción del profesor y reglas de UVU.

En el **laboratorio** de idiomas, LA 020 (<https://www.uvu.edu/lang/lab/>), hay tutores que los pueden ayudar a repasar principios de gramática complicados, como la acentuación.

Las **composiciones** serán escritas en clase. En los días pertinentes, dedicaremos tiempo de clase para escribir A MANO. Lo escrito será entregado ese mismo día. Recibirán comentarios relacionados a la organización, expresión de las ideas, gramática, vocabulario, etc.

La nota se basará en el cumplimiento de los requisitos dados, así como en la corrección gramatical basada en los temas ya hablados en clase. Si faltan a clase el día de taller de escritura, es su responsabilidad completar la asignación antes de la siguiente clase y entregarla.

**Prácticas de verbos:** a lo largo del semestre, el alumno deberá completar prácticas de conjugaciones de verbos en CANVAS. Podrá hacer cada una ilimitada cantidad de veces hasta la fecha límite. Quedará la nota más alta. *NO habrá oportunidad de completarlas después de la fecha límite.*

**Presentación cultural:** El propósito de la presentación cultural, es dar a conocer un aspecto relevante y consecuente de una cultura en particular. No se trata de hablar de cosas de conocimiento general ni de listar cosas que aprendieron por medio de sus viajes o experiencias. Se trata de una investigación profunda. Esta asignación se cumplirá en etapas y será hecha en parejas.

La primera etapa, será escoger un tema (hay una lista de temas y fechas) y preparar un bosquejo o informe con los puntos principales a investigar, así como las posibles fuentes. Se debe usar al menos tres fuentes confiables y preferentemente en español (NO Wikipedia). Este informe se deberá entregar por CANVAS.

La segunda etapa será investigar y preparar una presentación en PPT o algún otro medio. La presentación debe ser de entre 8 a 10 minutos. Será presentada en clase, al comienzo de la clase. Ese día, deben llegar temprano y preparados para presentar. Se recomienda verificar con anticipación el acceso a la presentación o tenerla en un USB drive para que sea más rápido el acceso. La pareja será evaluada en la preparación, presentación, creatividad y gramática de su presentación cultural.

La tercera etapa es para el público (los alumnos que oyeron la presentación). Deberán, en Discussions, comentar algo de la presentación que los sorprendió o que desean investigar más. Pueden, incluso, agregar enlaces a páginas donde se expanda el tema o responder a los comentarios de sus compañeros. Recibirán puntos por participar.

Los **exámenes** serán rendidos de acuerdo con el horario, durante el horario de clase y en persona (no serán ofrecidos de manera remota).
