

# THE THREE LANGUAGES OF OUR STORY

In *Mariposa/Butterfly*, it is springtime in Texas and two next-door neighbors are busy tending to their flowers and vegetables. The first neighbor only speaks Spanish and the second neighbor only speaks English. In our show, we have also added American Sign Language to eight words so you can participate in the story with us! Listen for the tambourine, follow the cast, and perform these signs with us. The words will always be spoken in English before they are signed.


## DESIGN YOUR OWN MARIPOSA/BUTTERFLY

Decorate your own butterfly using the template below. What patterns, shapes, colors, and lines might you add? Consider modeling your design after the Monarch butterfly featured on the learning stage front cover. Or you could highlight the color green for the first neighbor or pink for the second neighbor.

### WRITE A MIGRATION Song for your Butterfly

Did you know that migrating Monarch butterflies can live for over nine months as they travel all over the United States and Mexico to breed and return home? They use the position of the sun to orient themselves during their long journey. By sensing the Earth's magnetic field, they can find the right direction to travel in any weather.

In our show, the neighbors each sing a song to the butterfly. Below are the lyrics



and English translation for the first neighbor's Spanish lullaby.

In the last column below, write a short song to sing to your butterfly as it prepares to make its long migration journey. Consider writing about how the butterfly looks or makes you feel. Even though you may miss your butterfly, our show reminds us..."We will see butterflies again."
