Step 1: Read the entire book.

- If it is an Academy book – PLEASE DO NOT WRITE IN THE BOOK.
- If it is your own personal book – PLEASE HIGHLIGHT THE GOOD PARTS.
- Suggest making notes about the portions of the book that you feel are the most important for a manager to understand.
- Suggest having this book in your personal library.

Step 2: The Written Report:

- Report on at least three principles in the book that you feel are most important for a manager to know and understand and why.
- Illustrate these principles with examples from your own life experiences.
- Minimum of three pages, double spaced, 12 font, Times New Roman, with a title page, stapled in the upper left corner.
- Due date is the same as the presentation.

Step 3: The Oral Presentation:

- 10 minute presentation about the three principles they feel are most important for managers to understand and why.
- Handouts are required, PowerPoint may be used with the presentation on a thumb drive, timing must not exceed 9:59 minutes.
- Do not be boring but be professional.
- Use this as an opportunity to get more comfortable presenting ideas and conducting briefings for a future Chief and/or crew.
- Due date is the same as the written report.
