I-400. ADVANCED ICS FOR COMMAND AND GENERAL STAFF AND COMPLEX INCIDENTS

Course Description

This course directs students toward an operational understanding of large single-agency and complex multi-agency/multi-jurisdictional incident responses. Topics include a fundamentals review for command and general staff, major and/or complex incident/event management, area command, and multi-agency coordination.

This course was developed in conjunction with the US Fire Administration's H467 course and the Emergency Management Institute's G400 course. These courses are built on the same lesson objectives and content as the NWCG I-400 course and are interchangeable. They are all National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant.

Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Identify the incident management process of command and general staff functions during complex incidents as prescribed by the Incident Command System.
- Describe implementation of the incident management process on a complex incident.
- Describe the management and coordination process during multiple incidents.
