As a result, student members were able to sit at a roundtable to discuss more about Austria's policies at the United Nations and in particular with focus on Sustainable Mountain Development.

I was able to ask advice and information from Ambassador Jan Kickert and his diplomatic mission about policy priorities of Austria in regard to the issues of religious rights, empowerment of women (in mountain areas in particular), and the rights of the elderly. PR of Austria to the UN discussed policies of Austria to include minority languages, which were recognized by government institutions in the last few years. Additionally, Ambassador Jan Kickert stressed that his nation's policies regarding gender are progressive, and that there have been many efforts to ensure gender equality. When informing on religious rights, PR of Austria to the UN notified us that there is an official procedure for religions to become recognized by the government, and recognized religions include Islam, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, and other Christian religions.
