
## My Contribution to the 68<sup>th</sup> UN Civil Society Conference

On Monday, August 26 the 68<sup>th</sup> United Nations Conference (68UNCSC) began in Salt Lake City. I was very much looking forward to participating with my colleagues from the Utah International Mountain Forum (UIMF), a coalition of student clubs at Utah Valley University (UVU) through a student engaged learning in another United Nations conference. This year's theme for 68UNCSC was "Building Inclusive and Sustainable Cities and Communities. On August 25, I was charged with picking up Dr. Takeshi Utsumi from the Salt Lake airport and bring him to the the Alta club in Salt Lake as he was a distinguished guest visiting for for the UN conference. I had the opportunity to speak with Dr. Utsumi one on one during this time, he spoke to me about current initiatives regarding global cooperation with collectible and shared responsibilities when it comes to Sustainable Development Goals. As specific initiative he gave me a project summary on was to form an Electronic Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) to link together individual countries' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) simulations together, with the goal of eventually also creating an Electronics United Nations (e-UN). It was fascinating to hear the work going on about different initiative being taken to further SDGs and it was a great

opportunity for me to speak with someone with so much prior background in global technology coordination.
