She spoke of her work with this organization and how they have worked to help women and others in Utah and abroad. The last of the first speakers was Mr. Uday Teki the founder and CEO of Project Work Groups. He spoke on the partnership of his organization with Utah Valley University and its student organizations, along with the general work of Project Work Groups.
