On December 2, 2019, Rotaractors Yana Anderson, Albeny Singh, Jose Coreas, and Caleb Stowell, and I had the privilege of contributing to the 10th annual celebration of International Mountain Day at Utah Valley University (UVU). The celebration was an opportunity for us to discuss with those in attendance matters relating to the contribution of Rotaract as part of the Utah International Mountain Forum (UIMF) to the Sustainable Mountain Development (SMD) agenda of the United Nations in the state of Utah and at the United Nations during 2019. UIMF is a coalition of student clubs at UVU.

Hannah Bieker, UVU Rotaractor, spoke during the 63rd session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women in March; several Rotaractors, including myself, participated at the 68th UN Civil Society Conference in Salt Lake City in August 26-28, 2019; UVU Rotaract also commemorated World Polio Day on October 23, 2019. In addition, we raised funds for SMD activities through club rush, an organization of clubs on UVU campus committed to student outreach, at UVU.

Speakers at the IMD event included Dr. Baldomero Lago, CIO of the UVU office of Global Engagement, Dr. Rusty Butler, main representative at the United Nations for the Russian Academy of Natural Sciences, Ms. Wendy Jyang, President of Utah China Friendship Improvement Sharing Hands Development and Commerce, an NGO, accredited with the United Nations and Mr. Uday Teki, President of the Project Work Groups. Topics such as UIMF advocacy campaign at the 64th session of the Commission of the Status of Women (CSW64) in March 2020, building on the successes from the 68th UN Civil Society Conference, held for the first time in Salt Lake City, UT on August 26-28, 2019 were discussed by presenters in details. Michael Hinatsu and Lacee Meyer, UIMF leaders spoke about both achievements in SMD advocacy of the student coalition during 2019 and plans for the promotion of mountain targets and cause in 2020 at the UN and in the state of Utah.

They expressed how happy they are to see Rotary and Rotaract becoming involved with other NGOs and the United Nations in global efforts.
