
11th Annual International Mountain Day at Utah Valley University

On December 2nd 2020, at noon the 11th observation of International Mountain Day (IMD) at Utah Valley University (UVU) began with Dallas Karren, Utah International Mountain Forum (UIMF), Vice President, welcoming everyone to the event and laying out the event agenda. UIMF is a coalition of clubs at UVU, which advocates for sustainable development for mountain communities in Utah and everywhere. Jeff Hibbard, who is an UIMF member was tasked with introducing the first speaker. The first speaker was Sam Elzinga, President of UIMF.
