
## My presentation during the International Mountain Day celebration at Utah Valley University

with this, what the Kyrgyz Republic does for the development of tourism, and about what cases and projects are managed in Osh city and by our Osh Technological University.




Alitha Thompson as representative of Utah Valley University, moderates the event
