
#### I Am Humbled to Serve Alongside You

## Rotary International President Introduces Theme for 2022-2023



**Rotary International President Jennifer Jones** introduced her presidential theme for RY2022-23 at the recent International Assembly attended by most of RI's nearly 530 district governors-elect. Now she's hoping all Rotarians will begin to imagine the possibilities in the change they can make to transform the world.

Jones, a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada - and the first female president in Rotary International's 117-year history - revealed the thoughtful Imagine Rotary, as she urged the entire family of Rotary to dream big and harness their connections as well as the power of "service above self" in turning those dreams into reality.

Of the new RI theme which will guide his enthusiastic leadership team and Rotarians around the world in RY2022-23, incoming **Utah Rotary District Governor Jose Velasco** said, "Engaging members and caring for them is crucial for retaining them. Building fellowship is a fundamental action in creating a meaningful and engaging club which provides the environment for an interactive Rotary experience. In Rotary, as with most of us, we don't imagine yesterday, we imagine tomorrow!"

# Park City Sunrise Rotary Presents Its Service Impact Report to Utah Governor Spencer Cox

Governor Spencer Cox honored the **Park City Sunrise Rotary Club** with an official visit in June, an event that was 18 months in the making by the club's Program Director Steve Spaulding.



Dressed in Hazmat gear, Janna Young, Summit County Deputy Manager, and Carolyn Wawra, Executive Director of Recycle Utah, reviewed the statistics of the club's two Hazardous Waste Materials collection events (e.g. 16,796 lbs chemicals diverted from the landfill). Each board chair presented their own service project's figures.

Governor Cox talked about topics of keen interest to Utah Rotarians including the need for continuing service projects for the homeless, mentoring the next generation, and building stable communities of talented citizens *committed to residing full-time in Utah*. 



The 24th annual **Bountiful Rotary** "Coats for Kids" Car Show was an incredible success. Attendance was the largest ever with 407 cars registered as well as 13 cars for the epic Friday Burnout. We have never missed a year. During COVID we held a parade and still raised enough funds to support our projects. All proceeds go towards "Coats for Kids" Voucher program which provides warm winter clothing to than 12,000 children in 16 elementary schools in the South Davis area. Coats for Kids is designed so children think their parents provided the clothing! It takes many, many service hours from members, family, friends and the community. Sponsors include Burt Brothers Tire, local Ford Stores, Kentson Car Company and Bahr Dermatology.

Park City Sunrise Rotary awarded \$20,000 in grants to 37 humanitarian organizations in Summit, Wasatch Counties in June. The highest award of \$3,500 went to the South Summit High School Interact Club, which Sunrise sponsors, to fund financial literacy instruction for high school students. The grant doubled Sunriser's support - \$3,500 in scholarships and operating expenses for Interact. Additional grant recipients included Habitat for Humanity of Summit & Wasatch Counties, Park City READS, the People's Health Clinic, and the Children's Justice Center. Awards were lower this year because the club's highly popular and financially rewarding Shotski fundraiser has been canceled for the past two years. Shotski on Main Street, Park City, is expected to resume this fall.



The Layton Rotary Club hosted a group of 15 Rotarians from Columbia who were visiting Utah after the national conference in Texas. We also had 15 Emergency Response Personal from Roy Fire Department join us for an enjoyable day. They started with the Columbians at the Hill Air Force base Museum. After the tour they went to the Roy Fire Department for a tour of that state-of-the-Art facility. They all enjoyed a BBQ lunch after.

Brigham City Rotarians took top honors at the Box Elder Chamber of Commerce yearly awards Banquet. Randy Christensen was awarded Business Person of the Year, Tere Moore was awarded Total Citizen, the equivalent of a lifetime achievement award, and Daniel Kennedy was awarded Small Business of the year. We appreciate all the hard work our local Rotarians accomplish and are thrilled when some of their work is acknowledged. Congratulations!



June held two significant events for the **Cedar City Club.** First, with other clubs all around the world, we installed our new leadership. Past-president, Miriam Keener, did an amazing job, her efforts resulting in this year's Club of the Year recognition.

Incoming president, Tessa Douglas, has served as our public image chair the last few years and is looking forward to this new club role. The second event was a week of service in memory of Bob Tavano, a long-time Rotarian who passed away last year. Club members built and painted a new swing set for the local domestic violence shelter, among other acts of service, to celebrate his legacy.



Ogden Rotary was pleased to be the lead club on a District Conference service project providing 75 Rotary bags filled with snacks, coloring and activity books, markers, crayons, pens and other items for the Ogden YCC, a domestic violence crisis center. The Center requested the care packages for children who are accompanying their mothers as they take the brave first steps of seeking safety from abuse. Thanks to all the Utah Rotarians who contributed and helped assemble the bags, and to the Ogden Rotarians who delivered the gifts. We also cleaned up the Ogden River Parkway during one of our monthly meetings! We had a great turnout and as a result, we were able to beautify a large section of the trail used by walkers, bikers, fishermen and others who use the parkway. Those who attended were also treated to lunch hosted by a local taco truck! What a fun way to provide service!





Summer is here and there are great activities and events planned. That includes Wine into Water - Rotary Club of Millcreek's Annual Event! It will be held at Tracy Aviary this year (we've missed you over the last two years).
