Past Rotary International President and immediate Past Board of Trustees Chairman, John Germ came to Utah by invitation from District Governor Jose Velasco. He generously and patiently spent days with Rotarians with only one purpose in mind ... to energize the spirit of every Utah Rotarian to fight polio and to support the eradication program of RI in different ways such as:

- Increasing the awareness of polio as a threat to the children of the world and the need to continue to focus on the fight
- donating to provide funding for vaccines and vaccinators willing to deliver this lifesaving resource to children in every community on the planet.

With wisdom, life experience and his infectious sense-of-humor John was able to bring the excitement of a great speaker, spark our emotions and more than anything demonstrate ... Rotary is for all of us to make of every day, changing lives of children for the better and improving opportunities for many people around the globe.

The history of polio eradication is impactful. Since the 1979 beginnings there were about 350,000 cases across more than 125 countries in that year. And then in 2022 we are with only 29 cases of Wild Poliovirus.

Let's put our efforts together to make sure that Polio ends and then we can celebrate the final step of the global eradication program as a success for the future of children in the world.



### **Global Grant for Neuro-Clinic in Morocco**

MAIR clinic is a not-for-profit medical facility specializing in neurological rehabilitation, the first of its kind in Morocco.

Thanks to Rotary financial support, extensive clinical training was provided to MAIR staff. Indeed, two global grants were used to sponsor 80 U.S. volunteers - physiatrists, neurologists, therapists and nurses - who traveled to Morocco to train MAIR staff. These trainings greatly impacted MAIR service. The clinic started treating patients on September 1st, 2015 and patients from all over Morocco are now seeking treatments at this facility.

The current global grant (GG1983987) is for establishing the first curriculum in neurorehabilitation in Morocco and North-Africa. This is a



Attendees dressed up and were treated to a delicious meal, silent and live auction, live entertainment and were addressed by our District Governor Jose Velasco. The leaders of each recipient organization also had time to talk about how contributions would be used. Everything from Bartholomew the Bear to African Photo Safaris were auctioned. The two sponsors of the event were Rotarians: Paramount Tax and Accounting CPAs and Infinite Solutions.



On October 19th, the **UVU Rotaract** and **Orem-Lindon Rotary Clubs** hosted their Annual World Polio Day Presentation which included keynote speaker Dr. Joseph Johnson, Head of Provo Pediatrics, and UVMC Newborn Director. It was attended by 45 Rotarians, students, and community members. Through our partnership with Utah Symphony, UVU Rotaractors hosted a lobby display at their concert on October 20th to raise community awareness about polio. In preparation, UVU Rotaractors held a tabling event on UVU campus to further engage with students. 24 Orem-Lindon Rotarians and UVU Rotaractors held a service project on October 8th, in conjunction with Utah Rotary's Environmental Protection Initiative, and planted trees in Nielson Grove Park in Orem.



Since 2003 **Bountiful Rotary** has been giving dictionaries to 3rd graders. The kids love them! They

cherish having their own dictionary. Eighty 3rd graders at Odyssey elementary school received theirs. Oak Hills Elementary 3rd Graders just received theirs and the rest of the schools are being delivered by our dedicated Rotarians. We also did our 30th Annual Great Pumpkin Hunt. Rotarians, family and friends come in costume and eat dinner around a campfire and get custom made balloons from Sammy T Clown. At dusk the kids take flashlights and head into the woods to find their own pumpkin to take home. It's an incredible family event. We love getting together. A record 1,340 people tipped back High West whiskey and apple juice shots by simultaneously raising 515 skis drilled together. Park City Sunrise surpassed the previous record of 1,333 shots-taken in Breckenridge February 2022.

Park City Main Street was closed to cars as the excitement built to the countdown at 2 pm when the stoked crowd lifted the big U of skis to support community organizations involved in education, health care, food security, music and the arts, families, sports equity, and other important community needs.



**Murray Rotary** recently helped remodel the women's shelter of Rescue Mission in downtown Salt Lake City. Twelve volunteers tackled repainting the dining area, replacing the basement flooring, and removing an accumulation of 75 years of alternating layers of paint and wallpaper in the living room. The wallpaper removal turned out to be much more labor-intensive and timeconsuming than we initially estimated; however, our crew was in great spirits. We all left the project happily weary after a job well done!



The **Rotary Club of Logan** delivered dictionaries to each third grader in Cache and Rich county elementary schools as part of Rotary's focus on literacy.

To date he Logan Club has distributed more than 50,000 dictionaries over the years.

Many of these books have gone to college with their owners and occupied the former student's book shelf, tattered and well used.



The **Ogden Rotary Club** was pleased to be entertained by a group called Class Act. Class Act is a group of young performers from throughout the Ogden area who study musical theater through Kids Are Music.

They presented a patriotic program during one of our recent lunch meetings. These students are extremely talented and provided inspiration and entertainment to our group. The Ogden Rotary Club enjoys supporting future Rotarians!



On October 15, eight **Orem-Lindon Rotarians** and fifteen **UVU Rotaractors** contributed to the Utah Rotary World Polio Day Gala. Through a Student Engaged Learning model in action, Rotaractors assisted with set up, clean up, running the check-in table, and, most importantly, networking with Utah district Rotarians. This model encourages students to work as a group to solve real-world issues with faculty mentoring them. Rotaractors thanked John Germ, the past Rotary International President, and Governor Velasco for allowing them to contribute to the event experiences and funds. They will use the lessons learned to make a difference in the lives of mountain people in Utah and globally.



The Hurricane Valley and Zion Canyon-Springdale Rotary Clubs will merge on January 1, but that's not stopping them from bonding together well in advance. Several Hurricane Valley Rotarians went to Springdale on October 22 for the 20th Annual Auction for Education cosponsored by Zion Canyon. The two clubs have a longstanding relationship. But at the very last minute Mother Nature decided it was too cold! Postponed but not cancelled, so standby!

SGR also manned an aid station providing water and noisy encouragement to 7,000 participants in the St. George Marathon; hosted BYU students in town for the Huntsman Games and repaired some of 50 bicycles for Christmas for children in the tribal community of Halchita.



Last month the **Cedar City Rotary Club** inducted three new members, bringing the total membership to 115. Our club has also been supporting multiple causes, such as the Canyon Creek Services (a crisis center) in tree planting, as well as getting the Rotary Centennial Veterans Park ready with a new rock garden in time for Veteran's Day. We are also working on a project to donate 50 Thanksgiving meals to the local food pantry and homeless shelter, organized by a prospective member of our club.



The **Westminster College Rotaract Club** made 17 blankets and for donation to Primary Children's Hospital. This is part of our semi-annual blanket tying event with the Neuroscience club.
