## My presentation during a parallel event at CSW67

On March 6th - 8th, Utah Valley University (UVU) Rotaractors like myself traveled to the United Nations 67th Commission on the Status of Women to present in a parallel event. Rotaract is a student club that works with Rotary International to provide students service opportunities in their community.
