My Participation at the 14th International Mountain Day at Utah Valley University

Ambassador Aida Kasymalieva shared insights into Kyrgyzstan's advocacy for mountain regions and its people since gaining its independence in 1991. She highlighted the nation's sponsorship of the UN resolution in 1998, leading to the observance of the International Year of Mountains (IYM) in 2002. Kasymalieva's comprehensive presentation outlined the significance of mountains, emphasizing their role as vital resource providers, biodiversity hotspots, and protectors of water sources.

Kyrgyzstan's dedication to addressing climate change and promoting sustainable mountain development was evident in Kasymalieva's remarks. She detailed Kyrgyzstan's efforts to foster international cooperation, leading to the adoption of the UN General Assembly resolution "Five years of action for the development of mountain regions" from 2023 to 2027.

Also, Honorable Joseph Pitts, speaking virtually from Asbury University, commended UVU's efforts in organizing the IMD event for the 14th time. He recognized the university's commitment to raising awareness about sustainable mountain development in mountain communities.

The speeches by Dastan Abikov and Aidana Nurlanova underscored the global collaboration on SMD, with a focus on empowering women and positive change. Their commitment and anticipation for the UN CSW 68 in March resonated with my beliefs in prioritizing the role of women in shaping the future.

Dr. Atabekov Almaz and Tatiana Panfilenko, from OshTU, highlighted the successful implementation of the SEL model in Kyrgyzstan. Their testimonies reflected the positive outcomes of collaboration with UVU, contributing to the 2030 agenda of Sustainable Development Goals.
