



Baatyrova Gulnara Maryshovna, Minister of Labor, Social Protection and Migration of the Kyrgyz Republic

Baatyrova Gulnara Maryshovna serves as the esteemed Minister of Labor, Social Protection, and Migration of the Kyrgyz Republic, a role she has held since September 13, 2023. Born on October 29, 1963, she brings not only a wealth of experience but also a personal touch to her office, being a family-oriented individual, married with two children and blessed with grandchildren. Her influence extended beyond local healthcare provision when she was chosen to chair the Medical Accreditation Commission at the Ministry of Health of the Kyrgyz Republic from 2013 to 2022. This role was a precursor to her appointment as the Minister of Health of the Kyrgyz Republic in 2022, a position she held with distinction until her current appointment. In 1998, she was awarded an Honorary Diploma by the Osh Oblast Administration, acknowledging her service and commitment to healthcare and community welfare.
