

Rotarian Spencer Mack



Spencer Mack joined the Foreign Land and Road Director, which is part of the Rotary Club, around 40 years ago to build connections and contribute to his community. Initially motivated by business networking, he has grown to appreciate the service and friendship the club provides, both locally and internationally. Spencer values Rotary's impact, noting it fosters community improvement and supports meaningful projects worldwide.

He reflects on the Rotary Club's role in enhancing the quality of life in Orem, Utah, by connecting people who share a commitment to community service. His dedication to Rotary is partly shaped by family influences—his grandfather was a district governor in Arizona and a member of a service club, which instilled a sense of duty to serve. Spencer's wife, Jane, recently joined the club, finding satisfaction in community service and fellowship.

Spencer's favorite things about Utah include the state's four distinct seasons, natural beauty, and the strong sense of community, partly shaped by the church's influence. He finds fulfillment in community engagement, both within and outside the Rotary Club, and through his family connections, which he sees as extending his influence beyond Utah. His family originally came to the United States from Sweden and Wales due to their church affiliation, and they eventually settled in Utah to contribute to the growing church community.
